# NEWS & NOTES

## FIRST ROAD PLAYOFF MATCH

SDFC heads into its first-ever post-season road match, a Western Conference Game 2 in the Round One Best-of-three series. SDFC visits Portland Timbers in a rematch of Game 1 at Snapdragon Stadium on Oct.

26. San Diego beat Portland 2-1 in its first-ever playoff match with goals by Onni Valakari and Anders Dreyer. Portland got a goal from Kristoffer Velde. Valakari opened the scoring with a left-footed shot from close range, beating Portland goalkeeper James Pantemis from inside the six-yard box. The midfielder pounced on a rebound after a long-range shot by Manu Duah hit off the post.

Dreyer doubled the lead with a diving header from left to right, finishing a pinpoint cross from Luca Bombino. The Danish forward beat his defender and directed his shot into the lower right corner of the net. Velde pulled one back for Portland with a low, right-footed strike into the left corner of Claudio Santos' goal.

## THE LAST TIME THEY MET

This was the second-consecutive time SDFC and Portland met. Both teams played in the regular season finale with San Diego beating Portland 4-0 on Oct. 18 on MLS Decision Day. SDFC went on to finish in first place in the standings while earning homefield advantage. The win marked milestones and records for SDFC as it finished its inaugural season with a 16-9-9 record and 63 points. The 19 wins is a record for most wins by an expansion club and the 63 points is the most in MLS history, also by an expansion club. It also extended a road win streak to 10 games while finishing with a 12-4- road record. SDFC secured its spot in the post season on Aug. 23 with a draw against Portland the first time the clubs met at Snapdragon Stadium.

Portland beat Real Salt Lake 3-1 in a play in match to secure the No. 8 seed and earn a match up against SDFC in the First Round. Portland finished the regular season with a 11-12-11 record and 44 points.

Game 2 in the Round One Best-of-3 series will mark the third-straight meeting between both clubs. A San Diego win puts SDFC in the Western Conference semifinals. A win by Portland ties the series and forces a decisive Game 3 Sunday Nov. 9 at Snapdragon Stadium.

## RECORD SETTING REGULAR SEASON

SDFC finished its inaugural regular season with some records and notable milestones, amid qualifying to the 2026 Concacaf Champions Cup.

SDFC set a new MLS expansion team record for most wins (19) and most points (63) in a single season, surpassing LAFC's 2018 record with 57 points (16-9-9 record). SDFC also now holds the record for most wins by an expansion team (19 wins) surpassing St Louis City's 2023 record with 17 wins (17-12-5 record). SDFC also tied the MLS single season record for most road victories with a 12-4-1 road record in the post shootout era, set previously by CF Montréal in 2022 and Inter Miami CF in 2024. It also became just the second team in MLS history to win at least 12 road matches in a single season, joining the 1998 LA Galaxy (13 road wins). SDFC also equaled Inter Miami CF's (37 points) and the 1998 LA Galaxy (37 points) for the most points secured in road matches in a single season in league history.

## DREYER AND VARAS MLS AWARD FINALISTS

San Diego FC head coach Mikey Varas and Designated Player Anders Dreyer are among the finalists for MLS End of the Year Awards. Varas is nominated for the Sigi Schmid MLS Coach of the Year Award while Dreyer is nominated for the Landon Donovan MLS MVP and MLS Newcomer of the Year. The winners will be announced throughout the Audi 2025 MLS Playoffs.

Varas was named the first head coach in SDFC history on Sept. 16, 2024, marking his first head coaching role at the club level. In his debut season, Varas has led SDFC to a first-place finish in the Western Conference with a 19-9-6 record, earning qualification for the Concacaf Champions Cup. Under Varas, SDFC set new MLS expansion records for most points (63) and most wins (17) in a debut season.

Dreyer, 27, joined SDFC on Jan. 22 as the second Designated Player in club history. He immediately made an impact, scoring both goals in San Diego's inaugural 2-0 victory against LA Galaxy on Feb. 23 at Dignity Health Sports Park. Dreyer has been one of the breakout stars of the season with 19 goals and 19 assists for a total of 38 goal contributions. That's 59-percent of SDFC's 64 total goals. He leads the league in assists and his exceptional performance has earned him recognition as a finalist for both the Landon Donovan MLS MVP Award and the MLS Newcomer of the Year Award.

## DREYER MVP-LIKE MAGIC IN THE PLAYOFFS

SDFC forward Anders Dreyer continues contributing to SDFC's extraordinary inaugural season. The Designated Player scored again against Portland in the Club's 2-1 playoff win on Oct. 26.

This year, Dreyer has registered 20 goals and 19 assists combined in the regular and post season. Dreyer has scored five goals in the last three SDFC matches. He scored a brace in the Club's last two regular season wins against Houston Dynamo (Oct. 4) and Portland Timbers (Oct. 18). Dreyer now has a combined 35 regular and post season starts.

## OTHER NOTES AND NUMBERS

SDFC became the third expansion club in MLS history to win its first playoff game in its inaugural season (Nashville SC in 2020) and Chicago Fire in 1998. SDFC also tied the second highest scoring mark by an expansion team in its first Playoff match with its pair of goals against Portland on Oct. 26 (LAFC 2-3 loss to Real Salt Lake in 2018).

SDFC has won three consecutive matches, including the final two regular season games and has outscored opponents 10-3 in that span. It is also riding a 10 road-match win streak and has the most points on the road by an expansion team in a single season. (37), tied with Inter Miami CF and LA Galaxy (1998). SDFC also finished with a 12-4-1 record on the road, becoming the second team in MLS history to win at least 12 road matches in a single season, joining the 1998 LA Galaxy (13 road wins).

## 15 DIFFERENT PLAYERS, 66 GOALS

SDFC scored 64 goals through its 34 regular season matches and two goals in one playoff match. The club finished the regular season fifth in MLS. Inter Miami CF finished with 81 goals. There have been 15 different SDFC players scored the Club's 65 goals this season.

## THE POSSESSION GAME

San Diego FC SDFC finished the regular season leading the league with 60.8-percent average possession through its 34 matches with a 19-9-6 record with 63 points. Columbus Crew was second (58.5 percent). SDFC outpossessed Portland Timbers 65.8 to 34.2 percent in the club's last match. SDFC has also registered 18,910 total passes completed for a total average pass completions of 86.3 percent in the regular season. That was the league's second best behind Columbus Crew (18,022) completed passes, 86.6-percent.

## DREYER PLAYER OF MONTH/MATCHDAY 31

SDFC forward Anders Dreyer had another stellar month, this time in August. The Danish forward continues his antics as a candidate for the Landon Donovan MLS MVP award. Dreyer was named MLS Player of the Matchday for Matchday 31. Dreyer recorded an assist and scored the game-winning goal in SDFC's 2-1 win on the road against LAFC. The Danish international is now up to a league best 32 goal contributions in 2025 (14 goals, 18 assists), which include six-game winning goals and seven game-winning assists. His 32 goal contributions are tied with Zlatan Ibrahimović (2018) for the second-most by a player in their debut season in MLS history, trailing only Sebastian Giovinco (38 in 2015). Dreyer has been named MLS Player of the Matchday twice this season, previously earning the honor on Matchday 1.

Dreyer was then named MLS Player of the Month for August 2025 three days after being named Player of the Matchday for Matchday 31. Dreyer was named player of the month after having scored three goals and added two assists as San Diego produced a 3-0-1 record in the month of August enroute to clinching a spot in the Audi 2025 MLS Cup Playoffs. Dreyer's five goal contributions were tied for the third most in MLS during the month of August, and his three goals were tied for the second most. During August, the forward played 359 of 360 available minutes for San Diego and had a goal contribution in three of the four matches. Dreyer also produced the game-winning goal contribution in each of San Diego's three wins –the game-winning assist at Sporting Kansas City (Aug. 9), along with the game-winning goals at San Jose Earthquakes (Aug. 17) and at LAFC (Aug. 31).

It is the second time Dreyer has earned the honor this season after previously winning the award for his performance in the month of June. Dreyer joins Josef Martinez (2017) as the only players in league history to earn multiple Player of the Month honors for an expansion club in their debut season.

## SEASON ENDING INJURIES

### Alejandro Alvarado Jr.

Alvarado Jr. sustained a right knee injury in the 70th minute of San Diego's 5-3 victory over the Vancouver Whitecaps on June 25 at BCPlace. Alvarado Jr. Will miss the remainder of the 2025 season and will undergo surgery in the coming week. Alvarado Jr. made his SDFC and MLS debut on February 23, coming on in the 82nd minute for Anibal Godoy during the Club's 2-0 win against the LA Galaxy at Dignity Health Sports Park. In 2025, he has made 12 appearances (six starts), logging 486 minutes on the field.

### Andrés Reyes

Defender Andrés Reyes underwent surgery last week and is expected to miss the remainder of the 2025 MLS regular season.

The 25-year-old Colombian joined SDFC ahead of the 2025 campaign, making his debut on April 19 against Charlotte FC at Bank of America Stadium. Over his MLS career, Reyes has made 97 appearances (85 starts), scored five goals and added one assist across 7,132 minutes played.

## PLAYER OF THE MATCHDAY – MATCHDAY 1

After making history with San Diego FC on MLS is Back weekend, Anders Dreyer was named MLS Player of the Matchday presented by Michelob Ultra for Matchday 1. The 26-year-old Danish international winger scored the first two goals in SDFC history to pace the expansion side's 2-0 debut victory at reigning MLS Cup champions LA Galaxy.

With his brace, Dreyer became the seventh MLS player to score multiple goals in a club's inaugural game and the first since Eric Hassli for Vancouver Whitecaps FC in 2011. San Diego also became just the second expansion team since 2019 to win their debut game, following St. Louis CITY SC in 2023, thanks in large part to Dreyer – the first Player of the Matchday after a club's inaugural match since Fredy Montero achieved the feat with Seattle Sounders FC in 2009.

The MLS Player of the Matchday presented by Michelob Ultra is selected each matchday of the regular season through both media and fan voting in a process conducted by MLS Communications. A panel of journalists from the North American Soccer Reporters (NASR) comprises 75 percent of the vote, while an Instagram fan vote represents the remaining 25 percent of voting. NASR consists of members of print, television, radio, and online media.

## PLAYER OF THE MATCHDAY- MATCHDAY 11

San Diego FC winger Hirving "Chucky" Lozano was voted the Major League Soccer Player of the Matchday for Matchday 11 of the 2025 MLS season for his performance against FC Dallas last week. Lozano scored two goals and added two assists as SDFC produced its largest win in club history defeating FC Dallas at home 5-0. After scoring a brace in the first half, Lozano became the fifth player in MLS history to produce at least four goals and four assists in his first eight games with an expansion club. Later in the match, Lozano continued to add to his accolades as just the fourth player in MLS history to accumulate two goals and two assists in a single match for an expansion club. The most recent up to that point to do so was Carlos Vela for LAFC (October 12, 2018).

## PLAYER OF THE MATCHDAY- MATCHDAY 20

San Diego FC forward Milan Iloski was voted the Major League Soccer Player of the Matchday for Matchday 20 on June 26, 2025. The 25-year-old forward tallied the fastest four goals in MLS history, scoring four times from the 35<sup>th</sup> minute to 47<sup>th</sup> minute in SDFC's 5-3 win at Vancouver Whitecaps. It marked Iloski's first career MLS start as well as SDFC's first-ever hat trick and four-goal performance. He became the 10<sup>th</sup> player in league history to score three goals in 10 minutes or less. He scored seven goals in three matches over the course of 135 minutes. He scored nine goals in 292 minutes played. It was the fewest minutes for a player to reach nine goals in league history, surpassing Adama Diomande (9 goals in 472 minutes) in 2018.

## PLAYER OF THE MATCHDAY- MATCHDAY 28

San Diego FC forward Anders Dreyer was named to the Team of the Matchday for Matchday 28 after his performance during SDFC's 2-1 win at Sporting KC on Aug. 9. The Danish forward had a goal and an assist in Kansas City. He helped set up the first score of the match with an assist on Hirving "Chucky" Lozano's first half goal. He then extended the SDFC lead with a goal of his own in the 70th minute on a give-and-go play with Onni Valakari.

With that pair of goal contributions, Dreyer passed LAFC's Carlos Vela (27 in 2018) with the most goal contributions in an expansion season with 29.

## YOU ALWAYS REMEMBER YOUR FIRST

San Diego FC (SDFC) made history earning a 2-0 victory over reigning MLS Cup champions LA Galaxy at Dignity Health Sports Park in SDFC's MLS debut

on March 23, 2025. SDFC winger Anders Dreyer headlined MLS' Sunday Night Soccer with a brace, scoring the Club's first-ever MLS goal in the 52<sup>nd</sup> minute. Despite a late push from the Galaxy, SDFC held firm, and finished off the game with Dreyer's second goal of the night in stoppage time. SDFC shutout the LA Galaxy in Carson, ending their undefeated streak at home and becoming the first MLS team to defeat them at Dignity Health Sports Park since Oct. 21, 2023.

With their 2-0 road victory over the Galaxy, SDFC became the second MLS expansion team to win their inaugural match since 2019, joining St. Louis CITY SC in 2023.

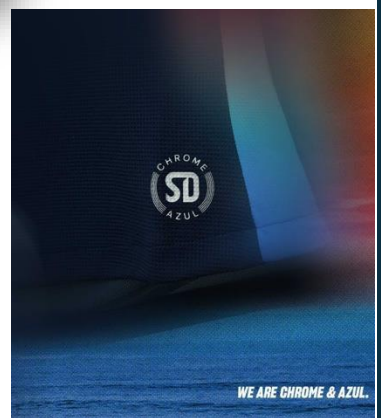

Chrome details seamlessly integrated into the fabric of the jersey shine as a reflection of the city's vibrant communities. The gradient side stripes, featuring the Club's community colors, symbolize the connection between San Diego's neighborhoods that define the city's diversity. The inaugural jersey also features a 'Chrome and Azul' Jock Tag in the bottom corner of the front of the jersey, and also features a 'State of Flow' Tag in the back collar of the jersey, emphasizing the way of life that best describes the essence of San Diego.

## KIT DESIGNED FOR THE COMMUNITY

SDFC officially launch the Club's first-ever secondary kit on Friday, December 14, 2025.

SDFC's first-ever **Community Kit** is a blank canvas for the people of San Diego. Anchored in the Club's mantra – "Woven Into One" – it invites fans and supporters to come together and imagine the future of the Club. This initiative introduces the community as a long-term co-creative director, shaping the evolution of future designs.

The Club's secondary jerseys in future seasons will be co-designed with fans and local artists through focus groups, design workshops, and community-driven campaigns to ensure each kit remains an authentic expression of San Diego's culture and spirit.

## Community Kit Design Elements

This year's predominantly white base represents the abundance of light in San Diego while symbolizing endless imagination. A subtle flow-like pattern, resembling both a tapestry and fingerprints, signifies the community's unique imprint on the Club's journey. Azul stripes on the shoulders and neck reflect the Club's core identity, while the lighter blue accents on the sides and collar nod to San Diego's expansive skies and ocean.

The jock tag '18' represents the heart of the Club – uniting all of San Diego's communities through the love of football. It also hints at the Colors of the Community, a key feature that will shape future secondary kits. Inside the collar, the phrase "Woven Into One" reinforces the Club's purpose and unity.



## Introducing Playmakers: SDFC's Artists & Creatives Program

To launch this long-term strategy and commitment to the creative community, SDFC is proud to introduce Playmakers – SDFC's artists and creatives program. For this kit launch, SDFC partnered with Claudia Rodriguez, founder of sustainable hand-sewn streetwear brand Sew Loka, to create six unique pieces that express the "Woven Into One" narrative through her unique style. SDFC also partnered with creatives Marcos Ramirez ERRE, Monty Montgomery and Paola "Panca" Villaseñor to express their art using SDFC jerseys as a blank canvas. Their work will be auctioned and the funds will go into a fund to engage Playmakers with the next generation of artists and creatives, starting this year with a talented group of young men and women from Hoover High School.

Playmakers will also be guided by a mentorship advisory board, featuring some of San Diego's most talented local creatives. Their role is to activate Playmakers as a platform for artistic expression and ensure the Club delivers on its promise of community collaboration. 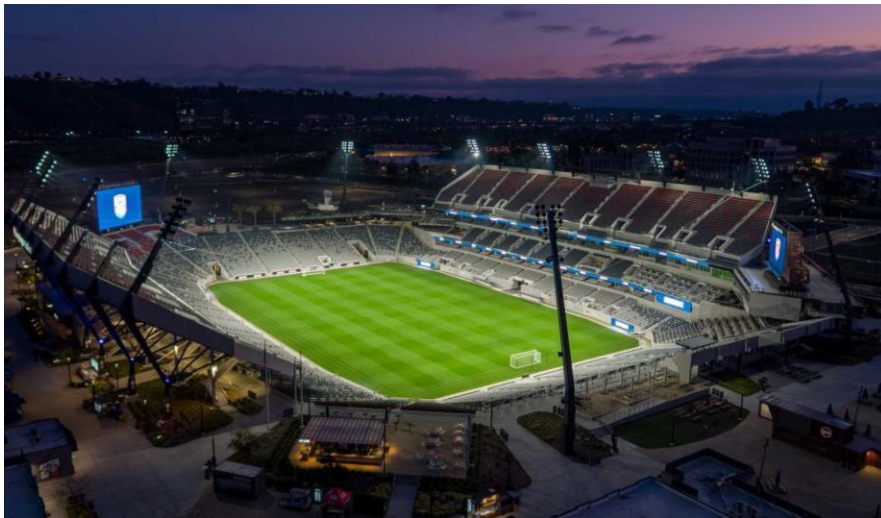


# RIGHT TO DREAM

## SNAPDRAGON STADIUM

The 35,000-capacity stadium is the largest soccer-specific venue in the United States. It sits on San Diego State University's campus and is also home to NWSL side San Diego Wave FC.

SDFC is set to debut at Snapdragon Stadium when they host St. Louis City SC in the Club's home-opener at 7:30 PT on Saturday, March 1.



## SHARP HEALTHCARE PERFORMANCE CENTER

San Diego FC officially opened the Club's state-of-the-art Sharp HealthCare Performance Center with an official ribbon-cutting ceremony and press conference on February 4, 2025. The Sharp HealthCare Performance Center, located on the Sycuan Reservation in El Cajon, is an integral part of the Club's 125,000 square-foot campus that features a 50,000-square-foot state-of-the-art sports performance center shared by the first team and academy teams, and five full-sized soccer fields, including three natural turf fields and two synthetic turf fields. A cultural focal point of the facility is the second-floor dining room and communal hub, overlooking the training fields, which will foster engagement between the academy players, coaches, teachers and professional players.

# RIGHT TO DREAM

## ACADEMY – RIGHT TO DREAM

Founded 26 years ago in Ghana, with additional outposts in Egypt and Denmark, Right to Dream is now establishing roots in San Diego. MLS's 30th club has access to the growing network's global reach, with the ultimate goal of forming local talent from San Diego, Mexico and beyond at their 125,000-square-foot campus in El Cajon on the Sycuan Reservation

San Diego FC's Right to Dream Academy will deliver excellence and innovation in player development by giving top talent the opportunity to develop their academic and athletic potential in a fully-funded residential program, the first of its kind in North America. San Diego FC's Right to Dream Academy is creating an integrated pathway based on the successful Right to Dream methodology for providing top talent a pathway from the academy to the professional team.



On 28 acres in San Diego, the home of the Academy and professional team is intentionally designed to foster engagement between the academy players, coaches, staff, teachers and professional players. The brand new campus site includes dedicated school facilities, student-athlete residential dorms, 5 world-class pitches, a state-of-the-art sports performance center, and a dining space that serves as the cultural focal point and communal hub for the campus community.

The Right to Dream Academy offers a unique and comprehensive talent development model that weaves together world-class football development, top tier education, and intentional character building. This holistic environment allows student-athletes to develop not just as elite footballers, but as leaders and changemakers who will make a positive impact on their communities and beyond.

San Diego FC's Right to Dream Academy is a fully-funded, free residential program, school and football academy. When the academy opens in the fall of 2025, San Diego FC will become the first Major League Soccer club to offer a privately operated school combined with a residential football academy.

Among the 6 newly renovated school buildings within the campus, the student athlete residential spaces will accommodate boys between the ages of 12-18, spanning grades 6 through 12. Starting in the fall of 2026, San Diego FC will create a non-residential, fully-funded professional player development pathway at the academy for girls between the ages of 12-18.

## TYLER HEAPS — SPORTING DIRECTOR & GM



Tyler Heaps joined SDFC as the Club's first-ever Sporting Director and General Manager. Heaps brings over 10 years of top-level global football experience from his roles at Right to Dream, AS Monaco, and the U.S. Soccer Federation. At 33, Heaps also becomes the youngest Sporting Director in Major League Soccer.

Heaps joins San Diego FC from Right to Dream, where he served as the Group Head of Recruitment and Insights. In this role, he helped build the first-team recruitment strategy for both FC Nordsjælland and SDFC. He also drove technological and data advancements to enhance internal pipeline tracking and external monitoring, leading to more impactful decision-making. Additionally, Heaps had been spearheading efforts for SDFC on roster and club strategy to ensure cohesion and alignment with Right to Dream's overall vision.

Before his time at Right to Dream, Heaps was the Head of Analysis and Insights at AS Monaco Football Club from 2021 to 2023. Reporting to the Sporting Director, he supported all sporting functions including recruitment, analysis, and performance. Heaps was instrumental in developing and providing insights across leadership, player recruitment, coaching, and academy performance. His efforts contributed significantly to AS Monaco's performance, with the team playing in the Europa League in two of the three seasons during his tenure at the Club, while also achieving a third-place finish in France's Ligue 1 in his first season at Monaco after they finished 17<sup>th</sup> on the table in the season prior to his arrival.

## MIKEY VARAS — HEAD COACH



Mikey Varas joined SDFC on September 16, 2024 as the Club's first-ever Head Coach ahead of its 2025 inaugural season. Prior to joining SDFC, Varas served as the Head Coach for the US U-20 National Team from 2021-2023, in 2024 he joined the senior squad for the USMNT as an assistant coach for the USMNT in 2023, and most recently served as the USMNT interim Head Coach in 2024.

Before joining U.S. Soccer, Varas served as an assistant coach for FC Dallas under former head coach Luchi Gonzalez for three seasons. During his tenure, FC Dallas reached the MLS Cup playoffs twice fueled by a number of standout Homegrown players from the club's academy.

**SDFC acquired Reyes from the New York Red Bulls in exchange for \$600,000 in 2025 General Allocation Money (GAM), \$200,000 in 2026 GAM and a future sell-on percentage. Reyes, has a guaranteed contract through the 2026 MLS season with a Club option for an additional year.**

Reyes signed with New York Red Bulls on January 18, 2021. In his four seasons with the Red Bulls, Reyes made 83 appearances (71 starts) and has scored five goals. In 2024, the Puerto Tejada, Colombia native appeared in 18 of 23 matches played, logging 1,492 minutes and recording one goal and one assist. During the Red Bulls 2024 Playoff run, Reyes started and played in four matches, logging 360 minutes, and scoring the game-winning goal in the club's 1-0 victory over Orlando City SC in the 2024 Eastern Conference Final, sending the Red Bulls to the club's second-ever MLS Cup final.

Prior to New York, Reyes was acquired by Inter Miami in February 2020, making 13 starts during Miami's inaugural season and his first season in MLS. Before joining Miami, he made his senior debut at the club level for Atlético Nacional in 2018 and went on to make 19 league appearances for the club. Reyes was also a member of the 2018 Copa Colombia title-winning side and 2018 Apertura runners-up.

At the international level, Reyes has made two career appearances for the Colombian Senior National Team. He made his senior national debut against Venezuela U-23's on December 10, 2023 in a 1-0 victory. Reyes scored his first career goal for Colombia in a 3-2 win against Mexico on December 17, 2023. Reyes was a member of the Colombia U-23 team that reached the semifinals of the CONMEBOL Pre-Olympic tournament in 2020. The center back has also represented Colombian youth teams at the U-20 and U-23 levels, making 11 appearances for the U-20 side and two appearances for the U-23 side. 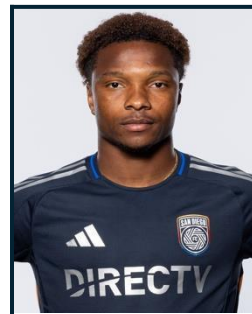

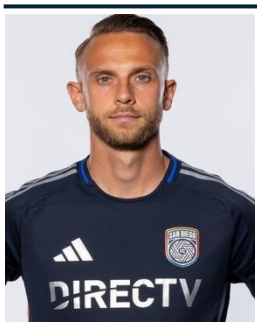

Lozano, widely known as "Chucky", has established himself as one of the most dynamic wingers in the sport. The Mexico City native will join San Diego following an accomplished career in Europe and Mexico, playing for top international clubs like PSV Eindhoven of the Eredivisie, Napoli of Italy's Serie A and C.F. Pachuca of Mexico's Liga MX.

As part of the deal, SDFC has also secured the exclusive global commercial rights for Lozano's image, likeness, and endorsements across all media platforms, including advertising campaigns and special events.

Throughout his career, the 28-year-old has tallied over 267 all-time club appearances in Europe, scoring 76 goals and recording 43 assists in all competitions during his time at PSV Eindhoven and Napoli. Lozano has won titles at every club he's been a part of, including the 2016 Liga MX Clausura and 2016-17 Concacaf Champions League titles with Pachuca, the 2017-18 and 2023-24 Eredivisie titles with PSV Eindhoven, and the 2019-20 Coppa Italia and the 2022-23 Serie A titles with Napoli. Internationally, the winger has earned 70 caps for the Mexican National Team, netting 18 goals and 12 assists all-time for El Tricolor. Notably, Lozano has represented his country on the world's biggest stage making seven appearances and recording one goal and one assist all-time during the 2018 and 2022 FIFA World Cups.

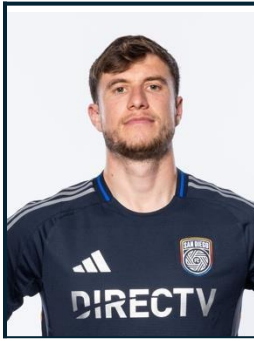

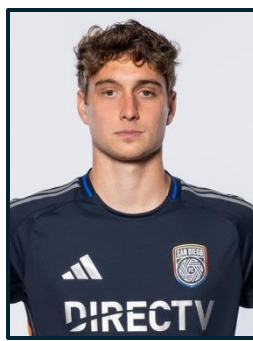

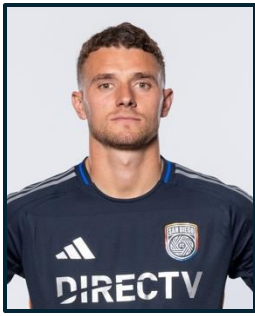

The 22-year-old then spent the first half of the 2023-24 season on loan at KV Kortrijk of the Belgian First Division where he made 12 appearances in all competitions during a four-month stay in Belgium before being recalled back by Forest in January 2024. Mighten was then loaned to League One side Port Vale Football Club for the remainder of the 2023-24 season where he appeared in 10 games for PVFC.

SDFC acquired the right of first refusal for Defender Christopher McVey from D.C. United in exchange for \$50,000 in 2025 General Allocation Money (GAM) and up to \$50,000 in conditional 2026 GAM if certain performance metrics are met. SDFC also signed McVey to a new contract through the end of the 2026 MLS season with a Club option for an additional year.

McVey signed with D.C. United at the beginning of 2024 in a trade with Inter Miami CF. During the 2024 season with D.C. United, the 27-year-old made 28 appearances, all 28 as starts, in all competitions. McVey made his debut for D.C. on Feb. 24 in a 3-1 home win against the New England Revolution. He went on to score his first goal with United on May 25 in a 1-1 draw against Chicago Fire FC.

McVey joined Inter Miami CF on Jan. 14, 2022 and spent two seasons with the club, making his debut for Miami on Feb. 26, 2022 in a 0-0 league draw against the Fire. He went on to score his first goal for the club on July 20, 2022 in a 4-4 league draw against FC Cincinnati. In his first season at Miami, McVey was ranked eighth in MLS for minutes played with 3,040. In two seasons with Inter Miami, McVey appeared in 61 matches across all competitions, scoring one goal and recording one assist on his way to winning the 2023 Leagues Cup title.

The Sparsör native started his professional career with IF Elfsborg academy, spending three years with academy before making his debut with the senior team on Oct. 1, 2017 in a 5-2 league loss to AK Fotboll. McVey made a total of 42 appearances across all competitions for Elfsborg between 2017 and 2021, gaining valuable experience by playing five UEFA Conference League qualifying matches in the 2021-2022 campaign. Over three seasons, McVey appeared in 42 matches for IF Elfsborg across all competitions, scoring one goal and one assist before signing with Inter Miami CF. During his tenure at Elfsborg, the central defender was also loaned out to Swedish second division club Dalkurd FF in 2019, making 17 appearances and registering one goal and an assist.

On the international front, McVey has represented the U-17 and U-18 sides of the Swedish National Team.
