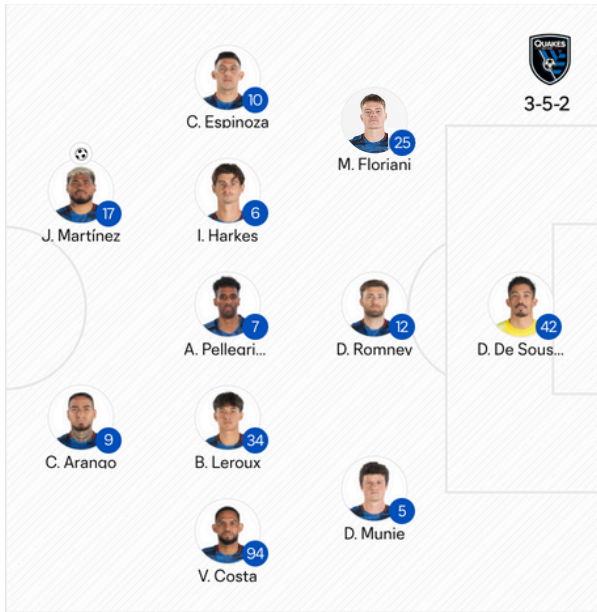

Bruce Arena

On the team's performance tonight:

"I thought our team played well. Obviously, Columbus is a very good team and playing at home. It's never easy playing here. I thought we played well. We had our chances to get a second goal for sure. I think overall, we had a good performance. It's something for our team to build on."

"We had some pretty good chances in the second half. I think Preston Judd had two or three pretty good chances. I think Chicho [Arango] probably had a good chance as well. [Columbus] obviously had a couple, and obviously their second goal was a counterattack where they executed quite well. So give them credit."

On the handball call that reversed an 83rd-minute Quakes equalizer:

"I'm still kind of unsure of what the call was. Obviously, we know it was a handball. But I think the defender played it off [Oussenj] Bouda, which is unintentional. It came to me. I just wanted to make sure I could put it over the line and they called the goal back. It's unfortunate. I think we created a lot of chances in the last 15 minutes of the game to really come back and score to tie it. We just weren't clinical enough and we hurt ourselves in that way."



Mark-Anthony Kaye

On the team conceding the 62nd-minute goal:

"It did take us a while in the second half. We were still in the game and I think the second goal kind of made it just a little bit more difficult. We picked it up in the last 15. Columbus is a good team—possession-oriented, high-risk, high-reward for them, that's their football. They gave us some chances that we should have put away. ... It's unlucky. We played well enough to get something out of this game. It's disappointing when you come back from the locker room and you don't have three points or a point."

The Earthquakes and Timbers are tied with the Vancouver Whitecaps FC as the highest scoring teams in Major League Soccer, each with 20 goals in 10 matches this season.

The Quakes' new additions have a strong history against Portland. Mark-Anthony Kaye has tallied six goal contributions (4g/2a) in 11 matches against the Timbers. Cristian "Chicho" Arango has two goals and one assist in seven games. Josef Martínez has netted two goals in just three appearances against Portland.



CAPTAIN CRISTIAN CAN'T STOP PRODUCING

Forward and team captain Cristian Espinoza leads the league with six assists. He is currently on pace to record 10 or more assists in MLS play and more than 20 goal contributions in all competitions for the fourth straight season.

If Espinoza plays on Saturday, he will extend his run of consecutive games to a current league-high and club record of 120. The streak is now third longest in MLS history and second among all field players.

WELCOME TO THE BLACK & BLUE

DEJUAN JONES & NOEL BUCK

on Tuesday, April 22, the Quakes acquired **DeJuan Jones** from Columbus in exchange for \$175,000 General Allocation Money (GAM) and an international slot in 2025, and an additional \$250,000 GAM in 2026.

- 2024 Leagues Cup champion (CLB) and 2021 Supporters' Shield winner (NE)
- 18 assists and 8 goals in MLS career
- 1 of only 3 MLS defenders with 5 assists each year from 2021-23
- Helped Revs reach playoffs in 4 of 5 full seasons

That same day, San Jose acquired New England Homegrown midfielder **Noel Buck** from the Revolution for \$600,000 cash, plus an additional \$50,000 if certain performance conditions are met. Buck, 20, will be a U22 Initiative player for SJ.

RECURRING SEASON STORYLINES

BRUCE IS BACK

Bruce Arena has returned to MLS as Earthquakes Head Coach and Sporting Director. With five MLS Cups and four Supporters' Shields, Arena is the winningest coach in league history. The 2025 season marks his 20th season coaching at domestic club level, with stops at the New England Revolution (2019-23), LA Galaxy (2008-16), New York Red Bulls (2006-07) and D.C. United (1996-98).

NEW IN THE BLACK & BLUE

Arena wasted no time retooling the roster, acquiring/signing 15 new faces from the previous year. Ten have made their Quakes debut in 2025: Veterans Chicho Arango, Ian Harkes, Mark-Anthony Kaye, Josef Martínez, Dave Romney, Earl Edwards Jr., DeJuan Jones, and three rookies making their MLS debuts—Beau Leroux, Reid Roberts and Max Floriani.

Counting new additions DeJuan Jones and Noel Buck, four current Quakes played for Arena at his previous stop in New England: Harkes, Kaye, Romney and Edwards Jr. Nick Lima, who actually started his career as a Homegrown signing with San Jose, also played for the Revs in 2024, but after Arena's tenure.

FROM SAN JOSE NATIVE TO SURPRISE OF THE SEASON

Beau Leroux, 21, was selected with the 42nd overall pick of the second round of the 2024 MLS SuperDraft out of San Jose State University. Last season, the midfielder and San Jose native was a fixture on the Quakes' MLS NEXT Pro team, The Town FC, scoring five goals and making 24 appearances (23 starts) in the regular season and postseason combined. Just one day after signing with the first team, he made his Quakes debut in the starting lineup on Feb. 22 against Real Salt Lake and immediately notched an assist. On April 29 against Seattle Sounders FC, he scored his first goal to secure a 1-1 draw for San Jose. His most recent and second assist of 2025 was against Columbus Crew on April 26.

SOUTH AMERICAN DYNAMIC DUO ... ACTIVATED

A pair of renowned international forwards—Venezuelan Josef Martínez (free agent, previously with CF Montréal) and Colombian Cristian "Chicho" Arango (trade with Real Salt Lake)—were acquired by Sporting Director Bruce Arena in the offseason to provide some firepower in attack. The prolific pair scored a combined 31 goals in all competitions the previous season. Neither has disappointed; as of May 2, they have six goals apiece.

SOUTH AMERICAN FANTASTIC FOUR ... ON HOLD

Martínez and Arango were set to pair with Argentine attackers Cristian Espinoza and Hernán López, but López, a creative midfielder and grand-nephew of global icon Diego Maradona who had notched 12 goal contributions in all competitions since arriving from Argentina's Godoy Cruz last May (9g/3a), underwent right shoulder surgery March 14 with a projected return date of three to four months.

JOSEF CLIMBING THE CHARTS

With his league-leading seventh MLS career hat trick on April 6, and his goal against Columbus Crew on April 26, he increased his goal total to 122, Josef Martínez surpassed Bradley Wright-Phillips (117) for sixth on MLS' all-time scoring chart. Next up: Jaime Moreno (133). He leads all active players.

CAPI ESPI ONE GOAL AWAY

With one goal, captain Cristian Espinoza will pass Jeremy Ebobisse for sole ownership of third place on the club's career scoring list (both have 34). The Argentine passed Landon Donovan for fourth with his goal against D.C. United on April 6.

RAINING GOALS

The Quakes are currently tied for the most goals in MLS with 20 goals in 10 games. Against D.C. United on April 6, they netted six goals—the first time they accomplished this feat in MLS play since a 6-1 win over the Miami Fusion on Sept. 19, 1999, and their first six-goal outing in any competition since facing the Central Coast Roadrunners on June 27, 2001, in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup.

EXTENDING RECORDS

After his April 6 hat trick against D.C. United, Josef Martínez extended his league-record tally to seven. The next closest total is five, accomplished by four players including Quakes legend Chris Wondolowski.

Cristian Espinoza's run of consecutive games is now at a current league-high and club record of 119 as of April 26. The streak is now third longest in MLS history and second among all field players.

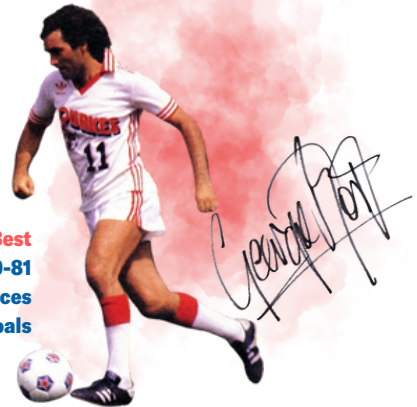

Community Highlights



Saturday Night Lights

The Quakes, in collaboration with Mayor Matt Mahan, the City of San Jose and Santa Clara County, along with Catholic Charities of Santa Clara County and other community organizations, launched Saturday Night Lights (SNL) presented by CalHOPE, a 10-week pilot program that offers middle and high school youth in underserved San Jose communities a safe, supportive space to play futsal soccer on Friday and Saturday nights. The program kicked off on Friday, April 11, at LeyVa Middle School in the Meadowfair neighborhood and then on Saturday, April 12, at CCSCC Washington United Youth Center. Games will take place weekly for 10 weeks.

America Scores

"Our partnership strengthened because the Earthquakes had the right people in position who understood the mission alignment and value of working with America SCORES," said Angela Bailey, SCORES Director of Corporate and Community Engagement. "The Quakes' involvement goes beyond financial support. They have actively participated in various aspects of SCORES programs, including volunteering, sending their players to events to inspire the kids, and providing access to games through their Tickets for Kids program."



Quakes Unified

The Quakes Special Olympics Unified Team consists of 23 players, ages 16-25, both with and without intellectual disabilities. Partnering with Special Olympics Northern California, the Unified game aims to provide athletes of all ability levels the chance to play and be part of a team while learning skills such as being a good teammate, winning with grace and encouraging others to carry positivity into their everyday lives.

Quakes Community Coaching Course

In collaboration with Positive Coaching Alliance (PCA), the Quakes Foundation will select a limited number of applicants from diverse backgrounds across the Bay Area to join the six-month course beginning in April 2025. The goal of the program is to educate, motivate, and financially support underrepresented coaches. Participants will receive personalized training from Quakes Academy coaches and Club Ambassador Shea Salinas. The curriculum will cover key topics such as developing style of play, building a positive team culture, season planning, and creating progressive training sessions.



El Camino Health

The Earthquakes and El Camino Health, an award-winning nonprofit healthcare system serving the Bay Area since 1961, have entered a multi-year partnership uniting two South Bay organizations with a shared goal of making meaningful impact on community health and well-being. As the Official Healthcare and Jersey Partner of the Quakes, El Camino Health will significantly expand the Earthquakes' existing Get EQ Fit program, a school health and wellness program benefiting elementary school students, to more than 40 schools and 10,000 students and their families annually. Additionally, the Earthquakes and ECH will introduce an annual Community Health Fair at PayPal Park.



BRUCE ARENA

SPORTING DIRECTOR & HEAD COACH

Bruce Arena is the winningest coach in MLS and U.S. Men's National Team history. The 2025 season will mark his 20th season coaching at domestic club level, with stops at the New England Revolution (2019-23), LA Galaxy (2008-16), New York Red Bulls (2006-07) and D.C. United (1996-98).

Arena has raised the MLS Cup an unprecedented five times (1996,1997, 2011, 2012, 2014), the Supporters' Shield four times (1997, 2010, 2011, 2021), the Concacaf Champions Cup (1998), the Copa Interamericana (1998) and the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup (1996). He has won the most regular-season games (264) and postseason games (35) in MLS history and been named MLS Sigi Schmid Coach of the Year a record four times (1997, 2009, 2011, 2021).

At the international level, he led the U.S. Men's National Team to heights previously unseen in the modern era. During his tenure in charge, the USMNT reached two FIFA World Cups (1998, 2002) – making the quarterfinals for the first time in 72 years in 2002 – while winning the Concacaf Gold Cup three times (2002, 2005, 2017) and finishing as the team's career leader in victories (81).

Arena, a native of Long Island, New York, also won five NCAA national championships (1988, 1991, 1992, 1993, 1994) during his time as head coach at the University of Virginia from 1978-95.

COACHING STAFF

Dave Sarachan comes to San Jose as an accomplished leader in his own right, having won the MLS Coach of the Year award (2003), the Supporters' Shield (2003) and the U.S. Open Cup twice (2003, 2006) as head coach of Chicago Fire FC from 2002-07. Most recently, he was an assistant coach for Maccabi Tel Aviv, winning the Israeli Premier League and qualifying for the UEFA Champions League in his lone season with the Yellows (2023-24). Sarachan will be reuniting with Arena for the sixth time, having previously served as an assistant coach on his staff at club level with the Galaxy (2008-16) and D.C. United (1997-99), as well as for two different eras on the U.S. Men's National Team (1999-2002, 2017) and the University of Virginia (1984-87). Alongside Arena, Sarachan has won four MLS Cups (1998, 2011, 2012, 2014), two Supporters' Shields (2010, 2011), one Concacaf Champions Cup (1998), one Copa Interamericana (1998) and two Concacaf Gold Cups (2002, 2017). During that second spell with the USMNT, Sarachan succeeded Arena as interim head coach (2017-18). A native of Rochester, N.Y., Sarachan possesses further head coaching experience with the Puerto Rico national team (2021-22), North Carolina FC in USL Championship (2018-20) and collegiately at Cornell University (1988-97).



Shalrie Joseph joins Arena for the second time after serving as his assistant coach in New England (2022-23) and as an assistant for the club's Supporters' Shield-winning campaign in 2021 while coaching various age groups in the Revolution Academy (2020-22). A native of Grenada who earned 20 caps and scored one goal with them as a player, Joseph took the helm as head coach of his national team from 2018-19. He eventually led The Spice Boys toward qualification for the 2021 Concacaf Gold Cup and promotion to League A in the 2019-20 Concacaf Nations League. As a standout midfielder who played 13 MLS seasons (2003-15)—11 with the Revs—Joseph was selected eight consecutive times for the MLS All-Star Game (2004-11) and received four MLS Best XI nods (2005, 2007-09). In N.E., he was teammates with current Quakes assistants Steve Ralston and Adin Brown, with the full trio overlapping from 2003-04. Joseph, a St. John's University alum, ended up playing in three MLS Cup finals (2005-07) for the Revs, capturing the North American SuperLiga in 2008 as well as the U.S. Open Cup in 2007.



Steve Ralston originally joined the Earthquakes as an assistant coach in 2015 after four years in the same capacity with Houston Dynamo FC. He took over as interim head coach of the Quakes for the final six games of 2018. After three years away, he returned to San Jose as an interim assistant coach in 2022. A native of St. Louis and Florida International University alumnus, Ralston retired from MLS in 2010 as the league's all-time leader in assists (135), games played (378), starts (372), and minutes (33,143). He scored 76 goals over 13 MLS seasons and played in four MLS Cup finals for New England, serving as captain (2007-09) and winning the North American SuperLiga in 2008 and the U.S. Open Cup in 2007. Ralston was named an MLS All-Star seven times and received MLS Best XI recognition three times (1999, 2000, 2002). At international level, he earned 36 caps for the U.S. (1997-2007) and scored four goals, winning the 2007 Concacaf Gold Cup.



Adin Brown returns to the Earthquakes as goalkeeper coach. Brown most recently served as goalkeeper coach for Chicago Fire FC (2020-22). Prior to joining Chicago, Brown was goalkeeper coach for the Portland Timbers (2015-17) and Timbers2 (2018-19), helping the club win its first MLS Cup in 2015. He also served in the same role for the University of Portland (2013-15). Brown, a native of Pleasant Hill, California, and graduate of De La Salle High School, attended the College of William & Mary and was just the third goalkeeper in NCAA history to be named a First-Team All-American twice. The third overall pick in the 2000 MLS SuperDraft, Brown appeared 85 times over seven seasons, making his mark with New England (2002-04) where he posted a 1.42 goals against average over three years and had the Revs on the brink of winning the 2002 MLS Cup. He also played abroad for Aalesund FK (2005-09), helping lead them to the Norwegian top tier in 2007. Internationally, Brown was the U.S. starting keeper throughout qualification for the 2000 Summer Olympics but missed the final competition due to injury.


