#PORvSKC: HEAD-TO-HEAD

Sporting Kansas City (3-7-1, 10 pts.) closes out their season series with the Portland Timbers (5-3-3, 18 pts.) when the team heads to the Pacific Northwest for a showdown at Providence Park on Saturday night.

Sporting already faced Portland just under a month ago at Children's Mercy Park, falling to a 4-2 defeat in head coach Kerry Zavagnin's second match at the helm. Sporting twice fought back from first-half deficits with goals from Shapi Suleymanov and Dejan Joveljic to go into the break at 2-2, but a pair of quickfire goals early in the second half for the Timbers doomed the hosts to a 4-2 defeat.

Sporting last visited the Timbers at Providence Park on May 25, 2024 and suffered a 2-1 loss. After Felipe Mora had given the hosts the lead, Memo Rodriguez equalized for Sporting only for Evander to bag a late winner.

Sporting is 9-9-7 all-time against the Timbers in the regular season, and have gone 2-6-3 in their last 11 against the Timbers. Sporting is 4-7-2 all-time at Providence Park - a venue they haven't won at since 2017.

#PORvSKC: PLAYER HISTORY

- Forward **Daniel Salloi** has four goals and three assists against Portland, notching his first MLS goal in the 1-1 home draw on July 1, 2017. He added an assist in the 3-0 home win on August 18, 2018 and another in the 2-1 road loss on Sept. 7, 2019, before scoring again in the 2-2 home draw on Sept. 29, 2019. Salloi scored a late equalizer in the 1-1 home draw on Aug. 18, 2021 and the game-winner in the 4-1 home win on May 28, 2023. Salloi added another assist in the 2-1 road loss on May 25, 2024.
- Midfielder **Erik Thommy** has tallied twice versus Portland, coming in 4-1 home wins on Aug. 21, 2022 and May 28, 2023.
- Forward **Dejan Joveljic** has scored twice against Portland, his first coming as a member of the LA Galaxy in a 1-1 home draw on June 18, 2022 before tallying in Sporting's 4-2 home loss on April 13, 2025.
- Midfielder **Memo Rodriguez** has one goal and one assist against the Timbers, tallying his assist in the 3-3 home draw on April 7, 2024 before scoring in the 2-1 road loss on May 25, 2024.
- Forward **Shapi Suleymanov** has one goal against the Timbers, tallying his first goal for the club in the 4-2 home loss on April 13, 2025.
- Defender **Dany Rosero** has scored once against Portland, coming in the 3-3 home draw on April 7, 2024.
- Defender **Tim Leibold** has one assist against Portland, coming in the 4-1 home win on May 28, 2023.
- Defender **Robert Voloder** has one assist against Portland, coming in the 3-3 home draw on April 7, 2024.
- Goalkeeper **John Pulskamp** is 1-2-0 against Portland, with the win coming in a four-save performance in the 4-1 home win on Aug. 21, 2022.
- Forward **Mason Toye** has one goal against the Timbers, coming as a member of CF Montreal in a 4-1 home win on Oct. 7, 2023.
- Defender **Andrew Brody** has one assist against Portland, coming as a member of Real Salt Lake in a 3-3 home draw on Sept. 21, 2024.

- Forward **Mason Toye** spent the closing stages of the 2024 season with the Portland Timbers, making five appearances.
- Forward **Khiry Shelton** played with Portland General Manager **Ned Grabavoy** at New York City FC in 2015.
- Defender **Zorhan Bassong** was teammates with Timbers center back **Kamal Miller** and goalkeeper **James Pantemis** at CF Montreal from 2021-2022.
- Forward **Mason Toye** was teammates with Timbers trio **Ariel Lassiter** (2023-2024), **Kamal Miller** (2021-2023) and **James Pantemis** (2020-2023) during his four-year stint at CF Montreal. Toye also played with Timbers defender **Eric Miller** at Minnesota United from 2018-2019.
- Defender **Zorhan Bassong** and forward **Stephen Afrifa** have been teammates with Portland goalkeeper **Maxime Crepeau** on the Canadian National Team.
- Forward **Dejan Joveljic** was in the Red Star Belgrade academy while Portland's **Miguel Araujo** was playing for the first team from 2013-2014.
- Portland assistant coach **Dave van den Bergh** played for the Kansas City Wizards in 2006, tallying three goals and two assists across 13 appearances in all competitions.

#PORvSKC: BY THE NUMBERS

Sporting KC Team Notes

- In a 1-0 home win over the LA Galaxy on Sunday, Sporting became the first team in MLS history to win a match without recording a shot attempt. Sporting scored in the 13th minute on an own goal from LA defender Maya Yoshida.
- Last Sunday saw Sporting secure its first 1-0 win since Sept. 16, 2023, at Minnesota United FC. It was Sporting's first 1-0 win at Children's Mercy Park since Oct. 2, 2022, against Seattle Sounders FC.
- Sporting has utilized 12 different starting lineups in the club's first 13 matches of the 2025 season in all competitions.
- Sporting had two wins and two losses this season during the month of April. Their two wins last month were more than the club had secured in April in the previous six seasons combined since 2019. Sporting had a 1-12-9 regular season record in April from 2019-2024.
- Sporting ranks second in MLS in progressive dribbles (209) and ranks sixth in progressive passes (499). Progressive dribbles and passes are dribbles and passes that advance the ball at least 10 yards closer to the opponent's goal line or into the penalty area.
- Sporting has won three penalty kicks this season, tied for third most in MLS, after winning three penalties during the entire 2024 regular season.
- Sporting ranks third in MLS in touches in the attacking third per game (183).

The center back won 100% of his tackles and ground duels, had 11 total defensive actions including eight clearances, and completed 28 of 31 passes (90.3%).
- Defender **Jansen Miller** also delivered a stellar performance in central defense on Sunday, finishing with a career-high and game-high 17 total defensive actions, 13 clearances (including seven headed clearances) and four accurate long balls.

Portland Timbers Team Notes

- With 1.91 goals per game on 1.38 expected goals per game, Portland is outperforming its expected goal total by 0.53, the highest clip in MLS.
- Portland is tied for fourth in MLS in goal scoring despite ranking 26th in shot attempts per game (10.7). The Timbers rank second in MLS in shooting accuracy at 46.6%.
- Portland ranks 26th in MLS in both shots (10.7) & shots faced (15.0) per game.
- Portland has conceded 1.73 goals per match, fourth most in the Western Conference. The Timbers have allowed multiple goals in four consecutive matches since April 13.
- Portland is 5-0-2 when scoring the first goal and 0-3-0 when conceding the first goal this season.
- Portland ranks 26th in MLS in total distance covered per game (112.1km) but second in distance covered from sprints per game (2.57km).

- Winger **Antony** is tied for second in MLS with 10 total goal contributions (four goals and six assists). He also ranks second in goal-creating actions (eight), seventh in fouls committed (20) and eighth in successful take-ons (21). Antony is tied for second in MLS with six assists. He has recorded an assist in four consecutive games, the longest streak of any MLS player this season.
- Attacking midfielder **David Da Costa** has two goals and five assists in his debut MLS season. He leads the league in successful through balls (eight) while ranking second in progressive carries (61), sixth in goal-creating actions (seven), eighth in successful take-ons (21) and 10th in dribbles into the penalty area (18).

SPORTING KANSAS CITY NEWS AND NOTES

WINS KEEP COMING UNDER ZAVAGNIN

Sporting Kansas City began a tough month of May in the best way possible by taking three points in a gritty 1-0 victory over the LA Galaxy at Children's Mercy Park on Sunday night, and will now look to take that confidence into a tough three-game road swing starting on Saturday against the Portland Timbers at Providence Park.

The win over the Galaxy this past weekend takes Sporting to three wins in five since head coach Kerry Zavagnin took over in an interim role. Goalscoring is up - from 0.86 goals per game in the club's first eight games of the season to 2.20 since the change - while the club has also posted its first two clean sheets of the 2025 campaign in their last five matches.

Sunday's result - coming in historic fashion as Sporting became the first team in MLS history to win a match without taking a shot - continued a trend of roller-coaster action over the past month, as the team has gone W-L-W-L-W since Zavagnin took charge.

Sunday's victory kicked off a hectic month of May for Sporting who will play seven matches throughout the month with five coming on the road - including a brutal seven-day stretch that starts this weekend when Sporting travels to Portland, St. Louis and San Diego from May 10-17.

AIMING TO TOPPLE HIGH-FLYING TIMBERS

Sporting Kansas City closes out the club's 2025 regular-season series with the Portland Timbers this weekend when the team heads to the Pacific Northwest for a Saturday night showdown against the third-place Oregonians at Providence Park.

The two sides have already met once this year - just under a month ago at Children's Mercy Park on April 13, 2025. In head coach Kerry Zavagnin's second match at the helm, the Timbers pounced on a slow start to the second half from Sporting to claim a 4-2 victory after the score was deadlocked 2-2 at the interval following first-half goals from Shapi Suleymanov and Dejan Joveljic.

Sporting last visited Providence Park on May 25, 2024, succumbing to a narrow 2-1 defeat. After Felipe Mora had given the Timbers the lead, Sporting responded through a brilliant strike from Memo Rodriguez but star midfielder Evander had the final say and won it late for the hosts.

The all-time regular-season series is tied at 9-9-7, with Sporting holding a 4-7-2 mark on the road. After winning during four of their first seven visits to Providence Park, Sporting has not won at the venue since April 15, 2017 when a Dom Dwyer goal was enough to secure a 1-0 victory.

VOLODER NAMED TO TEAM OF THE MATCHDAY

Major League Soccer announced on Monday the MLS Team of the Matchday for Matchday 11 of the regular season with Sporting Kansas City defender Robert Voloder honored as one of the top 20 players in the league after the team's 1-0 win against reigning MLS Cup champions LA Galaxy on Sunday at Children's Mercy Park.

Voloder partnered with Jansen Miller in central defense to help Sporting Kansas City hold the Galaxy to a single shot on goal and, in doing so, record the team's second shutout of the season. The 23-year-old German won 100% of his tackles and ground duels, had 11 total defensive actions including eight clearances, and completed 28 of 31 passes (90.3%).

Voloder joined Sporting from Slovenian side Maribor as a U22 initiative signing ahead of the 2022 campaign and has made 67 appearances to date, tallying one goal and two assists from center back. The German had initially began his career with hometown club FC Cologne.

MILLER SHINES IN SECOND SHUTOUT OF CAMPAIGN

Sporting Kansas City rookie center back Jansen Miller continued to prove his credentials this past weekend with a standout performance as the club earned a 1-0 victory over the LA Galaxy at Children's Mercy Park on Sunday night.

Miller, who has started each of the club's two shutouts this season having also performed admirably in the 2-0 home win over St. Louis on April 5, delivered a stellar performance in central defense on Sunday, finishing with a career-high and game-high 17 total defensive actions, 13 clearances (including seven headed clearances) and four accurate long balls.

The 23-year-old has enjoyed an impressive start to life in the professional ranks since being selected as the eighth overall pick in the 2025 MLS SuperDraft out of Indiana.

Despite a tough start to the season for Sporting, the team has gone 3-4-0 in matches Miller has started, while the Missouri native has also recorded the fastest top speed (21.35 miles per hour) of any Sporting player this season.

PULSKAMP RISES UP CLUB LEADERBOARDS

Sporting Kansas City goalkeeper John Pulskamp produced a standout performance during the club's 1-0 victory over the LA Galaxy at Children's Mercy Park on Sunday night, and now sees himself rise up the club's all-time leaderboards in a pair of categories.

While Pulskamp was only credited with one save on the night - a low stop on John Nelson in the first half - the 24-year-old also repelled various Galaxy crosses and near misses, particularly denying Gabriel Pec in the first half and Marco Reus in the second half.

By recording the clean sheet and a victory, Pulskamp moved into a tie for seventh in club history in both shutouts (eight) and wins (12) in the regular season, joining Eric Kronberg and Garth Lagerwey, respectively.

Pulskamp, who is in his first season as a full time starter between the sticks for Sporting, is poised to make his 100th professional appearance on Saturday in Portland, having played 55 matches for Sporting and 44 matches for Sporting KC II.

MAY PRESENTS DAUNTING ROAD SCHEDULE

Sporting Kansas City is in the midst of a brutal schedule throughout the month of May that sees the team play five of seven matches on the road, starting with Sunday's 1-0 victory over the LA Galaxy at Children's Mercy Park.

Looking forward, five of Sporting's next six games are on the road, including a daunting three-game road swing where the team will log almost 6,000 air miles in the space of seven days.

Thoughts on the match...

"I'd first like to congratulate the LA Galaxy on a well-played game. They are the worthy champions. I know their season hasn't been going the way they would have liked it to, but we knew it was going to be a difficult game. They're very good in attack. They have good attacking players and they have a style of play. We knew we were going to have to absorb some of that today. And talking about the back line, Jansen (Miller) and Robert (Voloder) were both individually fantastic, but the collective of the group today showed a grit and a determination of what it takes to win games when you might not be at your best on the day. That's a look that we haven't seen recently and something certainly to build off of, especially as we go on the road having to be in those situations. We've proven today that we can defend the game by limiting them to one shot on goal. We can defend the game. Obviously on the attacking side, we would have liked more today but we have to look at the positives and certainly the positives are that we defended like champions today."

On the performance from Jansen Miller...

"We knew it from day one. We knew we had a good person, a good player and a competitor. So that's not a surprise. He's got a great personality, both within the group but on the field he has a presence. And the thing with rookies or first-year players that are playing the professional game is it's hard to sustain the mental capacity you need to sustain yourself over the course of the year. He's at the end of his college season. He's not used to going week in and week out with this kind of pressure. So sometimes that takes a little bit longer. But we're pleasantly surprised that -- just like the goalkeeper is young, he's young -- and he's really transforming himself into a quality player for this league."

SPORTING KC AND CHILDREN'S MERCY KANSAS CITY CONTINUE TO IMPACT LOCAL COMMUNITY

A leading independent children's health organization dedicated to holistic care, translational research, educating caregivers and breakthrough innovation to create a world of well-being for all children, Children's Mercy Kansas City began a 10-year partnership with Sporting KC in 2016. Children's Mercy provides the highest level of care for children from birth through the age of 21. U.S. News & World Report has repeatedly ranked Children's Mercy as one of "America's Best Children's Hospitals."



The comprehensive partnership between Sporting KC and Children's Mercy Kansas City – which includes naming rights to Sporting KC's world-class stadium, Children's Mercy Park, as well as the Sporting KC II and Sporting KC Academy complex at Swope Soccer Village – is also at the forefront of Sporting's state-of-the-art training ground at Compass Minerals National Performance Center. In a first-of-its-kind collaboration between a professional sports team, a national sports federation and a sports medicine provider, the facility opened in 2018 and features the Children's Mercy Sports Medicine Center alongside Sporting Kansas City and U.S. Soccer.

Children's Mercy Kansas City is also the official health care and sports medicine provider for the Sporting Kansas City Academy and Compass Minerals National Performance Center as part of a multi-faceted partnership that focuses on the following three components to impact the local community:

1. **Strengthening community**
 - The partnership directly supports The Victory Project, Sporting's foundation to help children - including those with cancer and disabilities – through all of life's challenges.
 - Sporting KC players and staff engage with, encourage and inspire Children's Mercy patients throughout the year during hospital visits and special events.
 - FLEET, an innovative team of remote experience robots operated via an iPad, regularly attends Sporting KC home matches to provide an all-access interactive experience for patients at Children's Mercy. Manufactured by Double Robotics, the robot allows users to enjoy two-way live audio and video captured from a 150-degree wide-angle lens while navigating to control their own VIP behind-the-scenes journey.
 - Launched in 2018, the RED CARD campaign addresses one of the most significant social issues impacting children nationwide by empowering youth and adults to prevent and intervene in bullying. Through school assemblies and community-wide messaging, the RED CARD initiative aims to reach children, parents, teachers and coaches who have daily opportunities to create supportive environments and stop bullying in its tracks. In 2023 and 2024, Sporting and Children's Mercy teamed up to provide 90 students at 30 local elementary and middle schools with SKC jerseys on National Random Acts of Kindness Day as part of a Kindness In The Schools (K.I.T.S.) initiative.
2. **Improving access to pediatric-trained sports medicine**
 - The Children's Mercy Sports Medicine Center at Village West is located inside Compass Minerals National Performance Center and offers a full range of sports medicine services, resources and programming for youth athletes. More than two million high-school athletes and 3.5 million children under age 14 are injured each year in the U.S. playing sports. Only a small percentage are treated by pediatric-trained sports medicine specialists who truly understand the youth's growing body, developing brain and unique psychosocial stressors.
3. **Protecting youth athletes and educating parents and coaches**
 - The partnership provides athletic training, rehabilitation and conditioning programs for the Sporting KC Academy's six teams at Swope Soccer Village, which hosts Sporting KC II home matches as well as year-round athletic leagues, tournaments and other marquee events.

INTERIM HEAD COACH | KERRY ZAVAGNIN



Kerry Zavagnin was named interim head coach of Sporting Kansas City on March 31, 2025 following the departure of longtime Manager Peter Vermes. Zavagnin currently holds the MLS record as he enters his 26th season with one club as a player or coach.

Zavagnin took charge of his first match as interim head coach on April 5, 2025, leading the team to a 2-0 victory over archrivals St. Louis at Children's Mercy Park.

Zavagnin first joined Kansas City in 2000 as a holding midfielder and was an integral part of the club's midfield for the next nine seasons, during which time he helped lead the Wizards to MLS Cup (2000) and U.S. Open Cup (2004) Championships. He was named to the MLS All-Star team and the Best XI in 2004.

Zavagnin has won seven major trophies with Kansas City, three as a player (2000 MLS Cup, 2000 Supporters' Shield and 2004 Open Cup) and four as a coach (2013 MLS Cup and Open Cups in 2012, 2015 and 2017). Zavagnin has played or coached 923 matches with the club in all competitions, including 766 games in the MLS regular season.

Zavagnin has been involved in 84% of the club's matches all-time as either a player or an assistant coach (928 of 1,104 matches).

Zavagnin started his professional career with the MetroStars, where he played in 39 games over two seasons. After spending one season with the Lehigh Valley Steam (USL-1), Zavagnin arrived in Kansas City in 2000.

He played 237 games and logged 20,516 minutes for the Wizards, setting team records in both categories before being overtaken by Matt Besler early in 2018. He scored eight goals and added 22 assists in his nine seasons in KC. Zavagnin was named Team Defender of the Year in 2001.

On top of his club success in Kansas City, Zavagnin also appeared 21 times for the U.S. Men's National Team. He recorded one assist for the U.S., who went 15-2-4 when Zavagnin featured.

SPORTING DIRECTOR | MIKE BURNS



Mike Burns joined Sporting KC as Sporting Director in June 2024. Burns oversees the team's player recruitment and roster building strategy and the continued development of the club's professional player pathway, including MLS NEXT Pro team Sporting Kansas City II and the SKC Academy.

Burns spent 15 seasons on the New England Revolution's technical staff from 2005-2019, during which time the club won four Eastern Conference championships and one U.S. Open Cup. The former MLS player and USMNT veteran - who notably played for the Kansas City Wizards from 2001-2002 - joined the Revolution front office as Director of Soccer in 2005 before earning promotions to Vice President of Player Personnel in 2008 and to General Manager in 2011.

Under Burns, New England reached three consecutive MLS Cups in 2005, 2006 and 2007 and returned to the championship match in 2014.

From 2022-2023, Burns served as a consultant for Major League Soccer by supporting the league office in its continued growth of MLS, MLS NEXT Pro and MLS NEXT.

A native of Marlborough, Massachusetts, Burns played college soccer at Hartwick College in New York before embarking on a decorated playing career highlighted by seven seasons in MLS and 75 caps with the USMNT.

ASSISTANT COACH | ASH WALLACE



Ash Wallace has served on Sporting Kansas City's technical staff since 2012, aiding the first team coaching staff in a variety of roles. Wallace, originally from England, assists in planning and executing training sessions and provides valuable analysis for coaches and players regarding strategy while helping scout and develop game plans for upcoming opponents. Wallace holds a U.S. Soccer A License. Wallace's first involvement with the club came in August 2012 when he was contracted to produce a detailed scouting report on Seattle

Sounders ahead of the U.S. Open Cup Final, helping Sporting claim their first of four major titles during a trophy-laden decade. Prior to joining Sporting KC, Wallace was a member of the Preston North End coaching staff and also served as an opposition scout for Fleetwood Town in his native England. Earlier in his career, he worked with Preston North End's women's academy teams and Penwortham Boys academy teams while earning a Degree in Sports Coaching from the University of Central Lancashire.

ASSISTANT COACH | ROGER ESPINOZA



Roger Espinoza joined the Sporting KC's technical staff as a Professional Development Coach and first team assistant coach ahead of the 2025 season. In his role, Espinoza serves as an assistant coach for Sporting KC while also working with players on all three levels of the club's professional player pathway – the first team, Sporting KC II and the Sporting KC Academy. Espinoza plays a leading role in the development of young players at the MLS, MLS NEXT Pro and Academy levels through individual training programs and ongoing

mentorship off the field. Espinoza stepped into professional coaching after retiring as a player in the summer of 2024. He enjoyed a 16-year playing career highlighted by 14 seasons in Kansas City from 2008-2012 and 2015-2023. He helped Sporting to three U.S. Open Cup titles as one of the most accomplished players in club history and one of the longest-serving midfielders in MLS. From 2013-2014, Espinoza had a two-year stint at English side Wigan Athletic, scoring three goals in 57 appearances while gaining experience in the English Premier League and UEFA Europa League. On the international stage, Espinoza played 52 times for Honduras from 2009-2017, representing Honduras at the 2010 and 2014 World Cups. Espinoza also starred at the 2012 Summer Olympics in England – leading Honduras to the quarterfinals of the competition and scoring against Brazil at Wembley Stadium.

GOALKEEPER COACH | ALEC DUFTY



Alec Duffy is in his 10th season with Sporting Kansas City having been introduced to the organization as the Sporting KC II goalkeeper coach in the side's inaugural season in 2016. In his first season working with the Sporting KC first team, starting goalkeeper Tim Melia enjoyed a record-breaking season where he was named the 2017 MLS Goalkeeper of the Year. A former MLS player, Duffy began his playing career with the New York Red Bulls in 2009, making one appearance before joining the MLS reserve goalkeeper pool. In 2010, Duffy joined

USSSF D2 Pro League side AC St. Louis, making 30 appearances before returning to MLS with the Chicago Fire in late 2010. He announced his retirement at the conclusion of the 2011 season. Duffy then took to coaching, first working with Florida Gulf Coast University and then the University of Illinois at Chicago. In 2015, Duffy served as goalkeeper coach for Toronto FC II in their inaugural USL Championship season.

Joey Harty was named Sporting Kansas City's Director of Sports Performance and Science ahead of the 2020 season, stepping up from his role as assistant fitness coach which he held from 2018-2019. Harty manages all aspects of the club's performance department from the academy to the senior team. He oversees day-to-day training plans on and off the field, including work in the weight room, soccer session planning, on-field movement training, data analysis and more, aiming to optimize player health and performance. Harty joined Sporting's

organization in January 2016, serving as a fitness coach for the Sporting Kansas City Academy before spending the 2017 season as head fitness coach for Sporting KC II. The Colorado native then transitioned to assistant fitness coach for Sporting's first team in January 2018 before landing his current role with the club. Prior to arriving in Kansas City, Harty worked for Phoenix Rising FC and Grand Canyon University in Phoenix, Arizona. Sporting Kansas City acquired outside back Andrew Brody off waivers ahead of the 2025 MLS season. Brody arrived in KC having logged 238 appearances since launching his professional career in 2016. Capable of playing as a right back or a left back, he spent four MLS seasons at Real Salt Lake from 2021-2024, where he had two goals and 17 assists in 133 matches across all competitions.

Brody signed with RSL as a Homegrown Player ahead of the 2021 season and recorded an assist five minutes into his club debut: a 3-1 home win over Sporting KC on May 1, 2021. Brody enjoyed a career year in 2022, hitting MLS regular season career-highs in appearances (34), starts (33), minutes (2,960), goals (two) and assists (six) as RSL reached the postseason for a second consecutive year. Both of his goals were late winners that resulted in 2-1 triumphs.

Brody joined the RSL Academy in Casa Grande, Arizona, as a 16-year-old and became one of the country's most coveted college recruits, resulting in a three-year stint at the University of Louisville from 2013-2015, amassing nine goals and 15 assists in 61 starts. 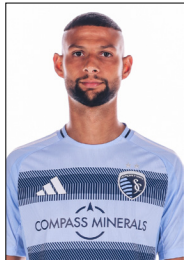

Sporting Kansas City signed Spanish center back Joaquin Fernandez midway through the 2024 campaign. A 6-foot-3 center back, Fernandez logged over 300 professional appearances during a 12-year European career, including 85 matches in the top-flight Spanish La Liga with Real Valladolid. Fernandez made his Sporting debut on Oct. 5, 2024 and played the final two matches of the 2024 campaign.

Fernandez was a starter in La Liga from 2018-2021, and although Valladolid was relegated to the second tier in 2021, the team bounced back into the top flight by finishing second in the 2021-22 Spanish Segunda. Fernandez made a career-high 27 La Liga appearances in 2022-23 and played his final match for Valladolid in a 3-1 victory over European powerhouse FC Barcelona on May 23, 2023. In June 2023, Fernandez moved abroad for the first time in his career by joining Turkish side Trabzonspor, making 17 appearances and helping Trabzonspor finish third in the league to qualify for the UEFA Europa League.

Fernandez joined the UD Almeria youth academy in his hometown and made his senior debut with Almeria B in the Spanish third division as a 16-year-old in December 2012. In 2015, he was promoted to Almeria's first team in the Spanish Segunda. Fernandez was a regular starter for Almeria from 2016-2018, logging 35 appearances each season. He played an instrumental role in NAC's promotion to the top-flight Eredivisie - tallying two goals and nine assists in half a season - and continued his loan spell at the Dutch club for 2017-18. The 2018-19 campaign saw Garcia go on loan to Toulouse in the French Ligue 1. In July 2019, Garcia moved to Sporting Gijon on a club-record transfer fee. Sporting Kansas City acquired striker Dejan Joveljic from the LA Galaxy in exchange for \$4 million on Feb. 1, 2025, marking the first cash-for-player trade in MLS history. Joveljic signed a new Designated Player contract upon arrival in Kansas City.

Joveljic joined Sporting on the heels of a brilliant 2024 campaign that saw the Serbian international record 21 goals and eight assists in all competitions, including six goals in the MLS Cup Playoffs as LA won MLS Cup. Joveljic amassed 85 goals and 26 assists during an accomplished professional career that has spanned Serbia, Germany and MLS in addition to loan spells in Belgium and Austria. The center forward was notably a Serbian SuperLiga champion at Red Star Belgrade and in 2021 joined the Galaxy, where he totaled 45 goals and 18 assists in four seasons as an integral part of LA's attack.

Joveljic developed in the academy of Serbian powerhouse Red Star Belgrade, turning pro as a 16-year-old in 2016 and helped Red Star to the 2017-18 SuperLiga title. Joveljic enjoyed a breakout 2018-19 campaign that yielded 11 goals in all competitions and his debut in the UEFA Champions League. Joveljic was transferred to German Bundesliga side Eintracht Frankfurt in 2019 and spent the latter half of the 2019-20 season on loan at Belgian heavyweight Anderlecht. Joveljic then enjoyed a loan stint at Austrian Bundesliga club Wolfsberger, tallying 20 goals and five assists during the 2020-2021 campaign.

On the international stage, Joveljic has scored two goals in seven appearances for the Serbia Men's National Team, having previously represented his country at the U-16 through U-21 youth levels.

Sporting Kansas City signed goalkeeper Jack Kortkamp as a Homegrown Player ahead of the 2025 MLS season, becoming the fifth youngest signing in Sporting KC history at the age of 16 years and 13 days and the youngest goalkeeper in club history.

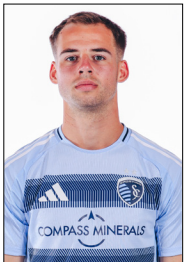

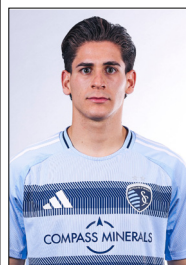

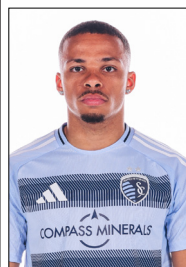
During the 2024-25 LIGA MX season, Munoz scored two goals across 15 Apertura matches prior to making an additional 12 Clausura appearances this spring.

settling in as a key figure for Celta, regularly competing in tandem with Fontas for a team that finished eighth in 2014-15. Radoja and Celta improved upon their fortunes in 2015-16 leading to a sixth-place league finish. Celta Vigo's 2016-17 campaign was highlighted by runs to the semifinals of the Copa del Rey and UEFA Europa League, where they fell to eventual champions Manchester United. Radoja moved to Levante ahead of the 2019-20 campaign. His first year at the club was highlighted by scoring in a 3-1 upset win over European powerhouse FC Barcelona.

Radoja began his professional career with Serbian club Vojvodina before embarking on an eight-year journey in La Liga. He logged 181 La Liga appearances from 2014-2022, playing alongside Sporting defender Andreu Fontas at Celta Vigo from 2014-2018 and spent three seasons with Levante from 2019-2022. Radoja developed in Vojvodina's youth academy and joined the club's senior team in 2011 prior to brief loan spells in Serbia. Celta Vigo acquired Radoja via transfer in August 2014 and he took little time

On the international stage, Radoja has two caps for the Serbia Men's National Team. He earned his senior debut in a friendly match at Ukraine in November 2016 and made one appearance in Serbia's successful qualifying campaign ahead of the 2018 FIFA World Cup. As a youth, Radoja represented Serbia at the U-18 through U-21 levels.

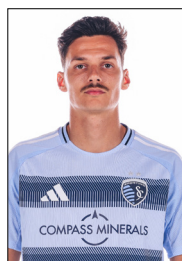

Daniel Salloi signed with Sporting KC as a Homegrown Player in early 2016 and made his Sporting KC debut on April 9, 2017. 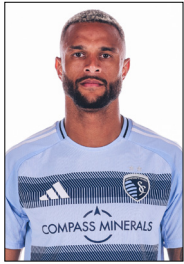

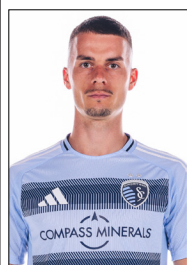

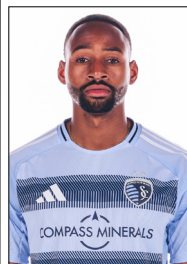
