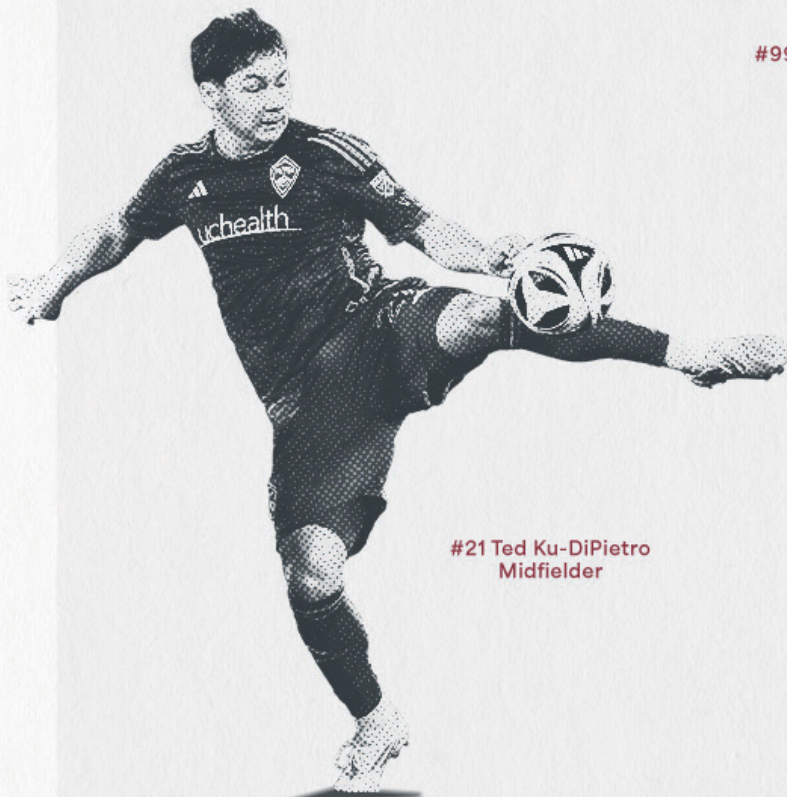
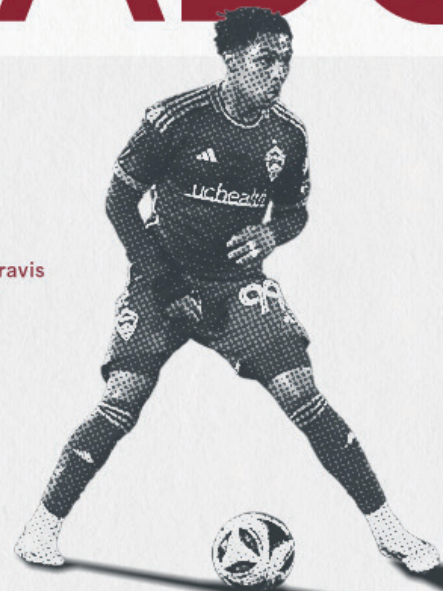


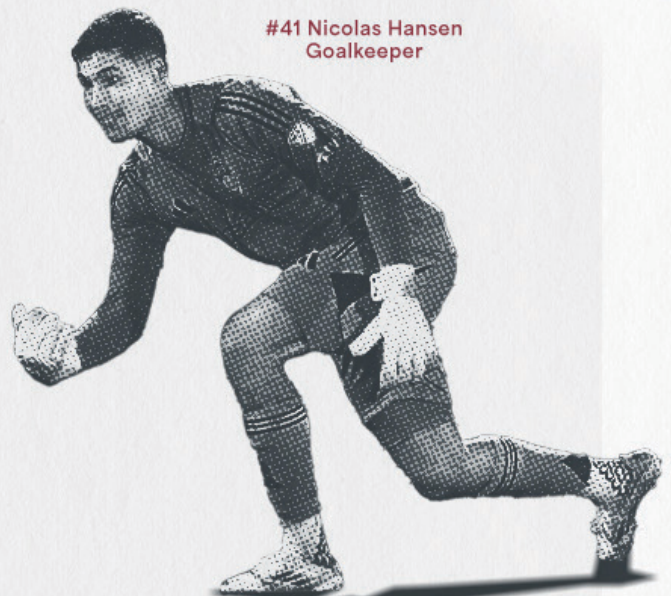

**NICO HANSEN TO THE RESCUE**

With U.S. Men’s National Team goalkeeper **Zack Steffen** sidelined due to an injury, the Rapids needed someone to step up. With big shoes to fill, **Nico Hansen** has done just that.

After signing a second team contract with Rapids 2 this season, Hansen quickly impressed the Colorado technical staff throughout preseason and early on in the MLS NEXT Pro season. His early

performances earned him a first-team contract on April 11.

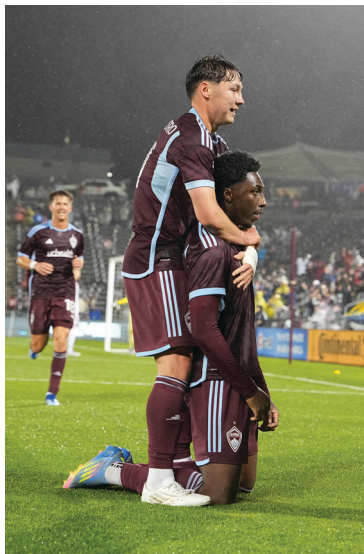


In three starts, the first three of his MLS career, the 23-year-old has shined. Hansen has posted two clean sheets with nine total saves and an undefeated 2-0-1 record in net.

Prior to his time in MLS, the goalkeeper was a member of the Weston FC Academy in Florida before moving to Europe to begin his professional career. At 16-years-old, he joined the Everton FC youth system, where he featured for their U-18 side until 2019. Hansen then signed his first professional contract with Everton on July 4, 2019, and earned a spot on the club’s U-23 side within Premier League 2.

Following his time with Everton, the Southwest Ranches native spent a season with Swansea City’s U-21 side before making the move to Atherton Collieries A.F.C. of the Northern Premier League in 2022. Hansen received consistent playing time with the club, having made 52 appearances with 12 clean sheets over two seasons.

**YAPI HOUR**



Last weekend against St. Louis, the match’s lone goal came off the foot of Rapids Homegrown forward **Darren Yapi**. The goal was Yapi’s third of the season, tying his single-season career high. 2025 has given the Homegrown the most consistent playing time of his young career so far, with Saturday night marking his eighth start of the season, also tying a single-season career high.

The assist on Yapi’s goal came from midfielder **Ted Ku-DiPietro**, marking his first since being acquired by the club this past offseason. The assist also came in his first start with the Rapids. Ku-DiPietro had started the season recovering from a shoulder injury alongside Yapi, who had a similar rehab schedule during Ku-DiPietro’s introduction to the club.

**ROUND ONE TO THE RAPIDS**



The Colorado Rapids kick-started their recent stretch of form following a major victory against Rocky Mountain Cup rivals Real Salt Lake.

**Djordje Mihailovic** scored the match’s lone goal in the 70th minute, sending the crowd at DICK’S Sporting Goods Park into a frenzy.

Homegrown midfielder **Cole Bassett** recorded an assist on Mihailovic’s goal, marking his fourth against RSL in his career, the most of any Rapid against Salt Lake. Goalkeeper **Nico Hansen** made his second start of the season in the matchup, posting both his first career win and clean sheet in the contest.

The second and final leg of the 2025 Rocky Mountain Cup series will be played at America First Field in Sandy, Utah on October 4.

Timbers winger **Omir Fernandez**, made 50 appearances for the Rapids across all competitions. He recorded two goals and five assists after joining the club as a free agent in December 2023. Fernandez was traded to Portland in April 2025 in exchange for \$200,000 in 2025 General Allocation Money.

**JOHN SPENCER**

- **COL:** Made 88 appearances, 79 starts, and logged 7,249 minutes. From 2001 to 2004, he scored 37 goals and provided 17 assists, tying for the third-most goals in club history. Spencer earned MLS Best XI honors in 2001 and 2003 and was selected to the MLS All-Star team in both seasons. He was inducted into the Rapids' Gallery of Honor on August 30, 2009. Spencer served as an assistant coach for Colorado in 2016.
- **POR:** Became the first head coach in Timbers history, appointed on August 10, 2010, and coached the club until 2012.

- **COL:** Made 148 appearances, 114 starts, scored 39 goals, and provided 27 assists in 10,442 minutes for the Rapids.

## ONE FLAG KIT

On Feb. 16, 2024, the **Colorado Rapids** unveiled the One Flag Kit. The One Flag Kit features the Rapids' signature burgundy as the primary color with sky blue accents on the sleeves and edges of the jersey. Its waved checker pattern pays homage to the supporters' flags seen throughout DICK'S Sporting Goods Park on matchday. A Colorado state flag is featured on the back of the neck, while the iconic mountain range seen in the Rapids' crest is emblazoned with a "96" in the bottom corner of the jersey, calling back to Colorado's place as an original team in MLS.



As part of the One Flag launch, the club announced a partnership with Colorado Soccer Foundation (CSF), a local nonprofit whose mission is to make the game of soccer accessible to all kids who want to play. For the 2024 and 2025 seasons, the Rapids are partnering with CSF to sponsor soccer-specific after-school programming in elementary schools within the Adams 14 school district. Students are coached by teachers from their schools, practice at their schools and play games at Soccer City Aurora. CSF partners with Positive Coaching Alliance to train the teacher-coaches to embrace the "power of positive" and to teach beginning soccer skills.

## HEADWATERS KIT

This year on Feb. 14, 2025, the **Colorado Rapids** unveiled the Headwaters kit, the club's community kit for the 2025 and 2026 Major League Soccer seasons, supporting efforts to restore and protect Colorado's rivers.

The Headwaters Kit draws inspiration from the rivers that originate high in the Rocky Mountains, providing water to millions across the American West. The design reflects the flowing waterways that shape Colorado's topography, symbolizing the connection between the state's natural resources and its people.



As part of the Headwaters Kit launch, the Rapids have partnered with Colorado Water Trust, a nonprofit organization dedicated to restoring and protecting Colorado's rivers. The Rapids will donate \$15,000 to the nonprofit, helping to benefit the 27 projects they operate around the state.

The Rapids' contribution will help fund initiatives such as increasing water flow to river segments, supporting aquatic ecosystems, and ensuring sustainable access for Colorado communities.

## DICK'S SPORTING GOODS PARK



DICK'S Sporting Goods Park has hosted some iconic games since it opened on April 7, 2007. Herculez Gomez scored the first MLS goal in the stadium as the Rapids defeated D.C. United, 2-1. DSGP hosted the MLS All-Star Game in 2007, against Celtic FC of Scotland, and again in 2015 against English giants Tottenham Hotspur FC. The U.S. Men's and Women's National Teams have enjoyed great success in Commerce City, with both the men and women boasting undefeated records. On March 22, 2013, the USMNT hosted Costa Rica in a 2014 FIFA World Cup Qualifier, known today as "Snow Clasico," a 1-0 U.S. victory played in a blizzard. The Rapids have played in two Snow Clasicos; first in a 2-1 win over New York Red Bulls in 2016. Then in March 2019, Colorado hosted Portland Timbers in the coldest match in MLS history, regular season or playoffs, with a kickoff temperature of just 18° F. The Rapids scored in 32 consecutive MLS matches at DICK'S Sporting Goods Park between October 2018 and August 2021, the longest streak in club history and the fifth-longest in league history.

## GALLERY OF HONOR

### Marcelo Balboa

Inducted: July 4, 2003

Balboa is a five-time MLS All-Star defender who started 146 of 151 regular-season games for the Rapids, playing over 13,000 minutes through six seasons with Colorado. In 2001, he became the first defender in MLS history to record more than 20 goals and 20 assists in his career. Balboa was inducted into the National Soccer Hall of Fame on August 29, 2005.



### Chris Henderson

Inducted: May 19, 2007

An original member of MLS, Henderson's career started in Colorado, where he played in midfield for the Rapids from 1996-98 and also from 2002-05. Henderson leads the Rapids with 53 assists, ranking first in club history. He also boasts 178 appearances and 170 starts, placing third in both categories. Additionally, he's sixth on the all-time scoring list with 31 goals and has 10 game-winning goals, the second-most in club history. Henderson, who had two stints with the club from 1996 to 1998 and 2003 to 2005, left an enduring impact reflected in his total playtime of 14,748 minutes, cementing his legacy as one of the Rapids' most influential players.



### Paul Bravo

Inducted: July 4, 2003

As a forward for the Rapids from 1997-2001, Bravo helped lead Colorado to their first MLS Cup Championship game in 1997 and first-ever appearance in the CONCACAF Champions League tournament in 1998. The former U.S. international was a three time MLS All-Star (1996, 1998, 1999) and his 39 goals with the Rapids was the most for a Colorado player until 2010, when he was passed by current record-holder Conor Casey (50).



### John Spencer

Inducted: August 30, 2009

Spencer was a former captain for the Rapids who played with Colorado from 2001-2004. The Scottish forward is tied for third-most in goals scored in club history with 37 goals for the Rapids. He earned MLS "Best XI" honors in 2001 and 2003 and was selected to the MLS All Star team in each of those seasons.

## GALLERY OF HONOR

### Pablo Mastroeni

**Inducted: July 25, 2014**

Colorado's most decorated player, Mastroeni was a seven-time MLS All-Star during his first seven years with the club (2002-2008). He also received the Rapids MVP honors in 2007, 2008, and 2010. Mastroeni holds several club records, including the most regular season games played (225), games started (217), and minutes played (18,669). Additionally, he served as the Rapids captain from late 2004 until mid-2013, leading the team to victory in the 2010 MLS Cup.



### Drew Moor

**Inducted: July 8, 2023**

Drew Moor joined the Rapids in 2009, helping the team to its first ever MLS Cup in 2010. In 2011, the defender broke the MLS Record for most consecutive complete games played by a field player with 68. A 2015 MLS All-Star, Moor closed out his career second in the club's all-time appearance record with 210 games played.



### Conor Casey

**Inducted: June 3, 2017**

Conor Casey became the sixth inductee into the Gallery of Honor. Raised in Denver, Casey stands alone as the club's all-time leading scorer, having netted 50 goals in 119 appearances. He also scored the equalizer in the MLS Cup win of 2010 and was named MLS Cup MVP. During his time with the club, he leads the team with three hat tricks scored in MLS by a Rapids player.

**Chris Armas** was appointed as the 10th permanent head coach in Rapids history on November 16, 2023.

**Armas**, 51, joined the Rapids with two decades of combined experience in MLS as a player and coach. The former defensive midfielder (LA Galaxy, Chicago Fire FC) enjoyed a successful, 12-year playing career in the league during which he won an MLS Cup (1998), a Supporters' Shield (2003) and four Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cups (1998, 2000, 2003, 2006). A six-time MLS All-Star (1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2003, 2004), Armas is one of only five players in league history to have been named to the MLS Best XI five times (1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2003). After recovering from an ACL injury sustained in 2002, he was named the MLS Comeback Player of the Year in 2003, as well as Chicago Fire FC's MVP during their Supporters' Shield-winning season that same year.

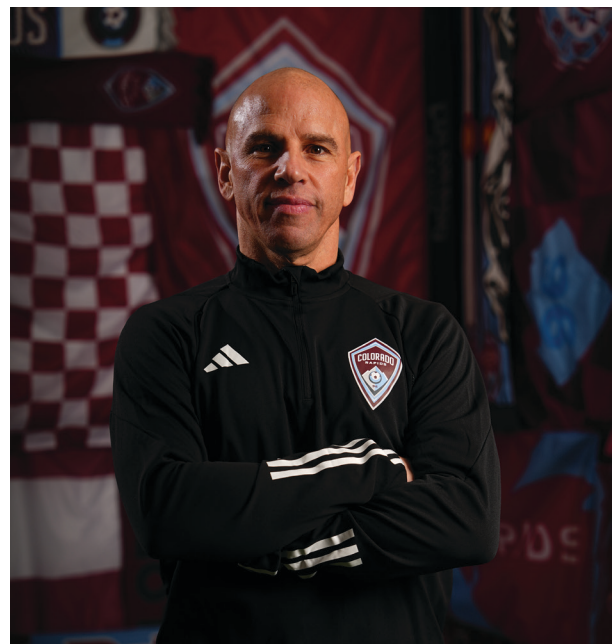
A native of New York City, **Armas** earned 66 caps for the U.S. Men's National Team during his playing career, winning two Concacaf Gold Cups (2002, 2005), as well as being named the U.S. Soccer Male Athlete of the Year in 2000.

After his retirement from playing, **Armas** began his coaching career in 2008 as an assistant coach for Chicago Fire FC before spending four years as head coach of Adelphi University's women's soccer team. In 2015, he joined the New York Red Bulls as an assistant coach as the side won the Supporters' Shield that year. Armas was then appointed Red Bulls head coach in July 2018 following Jesse Marsch's departure to RB Leipzig, finishing the regular season with a 12-3-3 record as his side won the 2018 Supporters' Shield, while also leading the club to the Eastern Conference Finals. Most recently, Armas served as an assistant coach for English Premier League sides Manchester United (2021-22) and Leeds United (2023).

In 2024, Armas earned his 47th point of the season, surpassing Fernando Clavijo's 45 points in 2005 for the most points by a Rapids head coach in their first season. The win also tied him with Glenn Myernick (14 wins in 1997) for the most victories by a first-year Rapids head coach. The match marked Armas' 100th as an MLS head coach.

## ARMAS ON BEING NAMED RAPIDS HEAD COACH

"I'm incredibly proud and excited to take the role as the head coach of the Colorado Rapids," said **Chris Armas**. "This is a club that has had success in the recent past and KSE is an organization that has a strong track record of winning championships. Throughout the process I was struck by the desire of the organization to return to the playoffs and compete for trophies. I'm as hungry as ever to deliver this success to our fans and our club. I've always been eager to implement my style of play at a club that plays and trains at altitude. This advantage, along with high energy, attacking and entertaining football, can help our team and fans return to home field dominance. I'm thrilled to have the opportunity to take the reins and to work with the entire staff to get the club back into the playoffs and ultimately to bring another MLS Cup to Colorado."

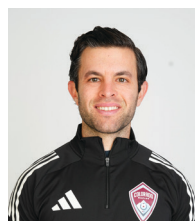
### Chris Little | First Assistant Coach

Little enters his fifth season with the Rapids. Little, a native of Edinburgh, Scotland, joined the Rapids as an assistant coach on Feb. 26, 2021, and also served as the interim head coach for the final eight matches of the 2023 season. Little's coaching background includes roles as head coach of the Tacoma Defiance in the USL Championship and Director of Coaching for the Seattle Sounders FC Academy. Before joining Seattle in 2017, he was head coach at Elon University and served as Director of Coaching for the North Carolina Youth Soccer Association, holding a USSF 'A' License.



### Chris Sharpe | Assistant & Goalkeeper Coach

Chris Sharpe is in his twelfth season as Rapids assistant and goalkeeper coach. Sharpe originally joined the club as an MLS pool goalkeeper from 2008 to 2012, and was with the club when it captured the 2010 MLS Cup. After retiring as a player, Sharpe became Rapids assistant goalkeeper coach in 2013. Sharpe's duties include preparing the First Team's goalkeepers and organizing set pieces, as well as scouting opponents. The Australian has been the Rapids Academy Director of Goalkeeping since 2008, overseeing the development of several top prospects, including Rapids Homegrown goalkeeper Abraham Rodriguez. Additionally, Sharpe is also the goalkeeper coach for Colorado's U.S. Soccer Training Center sessions and is the director of the Core Goalkeeper Academy.



### Ian Sarachan | Assistant Coach

Sarachan enters his second season with the Rapids after recently completed his fifth season as an assistant coach at Creighton University, contributing to a 36-26-10 record, which featured a College Cup appearance in 2022. During his tenure, the Bluejays earned 20 All-BIG EAST selections, seven of which were in 2022. Sarachan previously served as an assistant at Santa Clara University and the University of Wisconsin, guiding the latter to the 2013 NCAA Tournament. In his playing career at the University of Illinois-Chicago, he scored a game-winning goal in the 2007 Sweet 16 against Creighton. Sarachan launched his coaching career with the LA Galaxy organization and his father, Dave Sarachan, has held roles in the U.S. Men's National Team and is currently the technical director for the Puerto Rico National Team.



### Elliot Prost | Assistant Coach

Prost has been promoted to First Team Assistant Coach after initially joining the club in 2021 as an Academy coach focused on the U-17 age group. In his new role, Prost will support Head Coach Chris Armas and the technical staff in the planning, execution, and evaluation of daily training sessions, as well as match preparation and in-game analysis. He will also assist in managing player communication, team meetings, and coordination with support staff.



### Matt Gordon | First Team Analyst

Gordon, enters his second season with the first team after being promoted from Rapids 2 video analyst. He joined the Rapids in October 2021 as a video analyst intern before transitioning to a full-time role with Rapids 2 in 2022. Gordon has 16 years of experience as a director of coaching at youth clubs in New Mexico, New England and the Colorado Rapids Youth Soccer Club and served as the head coach of Albuquerque Sol FC in the USL League 2.
