2025 PLAYOFFS CLINCHED WITH DECISION DAY DRAW AT ST. LOUIS ::

Real Salt Lake (12-17-5, 41 points, 9th West / 19th Shield) finished its 2025 Major League Soccer regular season with a 2-2 draw at St. Louis CITY SC on Saturday's MLS "Decision Day" ...

The 2-2 draw clinched RSL's Conference-best fifth consecutive postseason berth, advancing to the Audi MLS Cup Playoffs for the seventh time in eight seasons (2020 the lone exception), and for the 15th occasion in the last 18 campaigns since first qualifying in 2008 (the 2015 and 2017 non-playoff years are the other outliers) ...

Wednesday, RSL travels to face Portland Timbers FC (11-12-11, 44 points, 8th West / 17th Shield) at Providence Park near downtown Portland, with the winner advancing to participate in the best-of-three game First-Round Series against San Diego FC, this year's Western Conference reg. season champion and the No. 1 overall West seed ...

Should RSL get past Portland, it would play Leg One of the First Round series Sunday, Oct. 26 at Snapdragon Stadium in San Diego (7:30p MT kickoff), with its lone potential home RSL playoff game this year occurring on Sat., Nov. 1 at America First Field (also a 7:30p MT kickoff, with tickets available at www.RSL.com/tickets with a Wednesday victory or shootout win) ...

Wednesday's RSL contest is available via Apple TV+ / MLS Season Pass, with **Tony Husband** and **Ross Smith** (ENG) joined by **Andrew Wiebe** on the call, as are **Carlos Suarez** and **Jesus Acosta** (SPN). Iconic RSL voice **David James** will call the game live from Portland for KSL Sports Radio (1160 AM / 97.5 FM), with **Nelson Moran** in his 21st season as RSL's Spanish radio home on both 102.3 KDUT FM / 106.3 FM KBMG.

POSTSEASON HISTORY vs. PORTLAND TIMBERS ::

Real Salt Lake and Portland have met on three prior Audi MLS Cup Playoff occasions, the last occurring in the 2021 Western Conference Final played at Providence Park, a 2-0 Timbers victory ... RSL eliminated Portland from the MLS postseason in both 2019 (a 2-1, single-game elimination in the West Semifinal stage) and 2013 (a 4-2 aggregate goal series win after 180 minutes, including a 1-0 road victory in the second leg of the West Final) ...

RSL is unbeaten in its last three games played against the Timbers, drawing twice at home in 2024 and 2025

and winning in the Pacific Northwest earlier this season ...

Back on July 16, RSL won 1-0 at Portland, utilizing a late game-winner from **Diogo Goncalves**, set up by an assist from substitute **Ari Piol** ... That particular defensive clean sheet was the seventh of nine overall in this 39-game campaign, with outstanding RSL goalkeeper and Captain **Rafael Cabral** registering an xGA of nearly 8.00 higher than what he's conceded, according to StatsBomb ...

Cabral stopped an MLS-high four of the nine penalty kicks he faced this season in regulation, along with an outstanding performance in the dramatic PK shootout against Club América on July 30 ...

OLATUNJI HONORED FOR BREAKOUT PERFORMANCE AT ST. LOUIS ::

Real Salt Lake striker **Victor Olatunji** was named to MLSSoccer.com's latest MLS "Team of the Matchday" for his two-goal performance Saturday in RSL's 2-2 "Decision Day" draw at St. Louis ... Olatunji's brace Saturday night was RSL's fourth of the 2025 campaign, with two previously in MLS reg. season action (both by **Diego Luna**) and one by **Braian Ojeda** in Leagues Cup ...

Both of Olatunji's goals came in the first 32 minutes on a rainy night at Energizer Park, giving RSL a 2-0 lead just past the half-hour mark ... Taking a precise through-ball from playmaking DP **Diogo Goncalves** to break open the defense, Olatunji's 60-yard sprint onto the ball enabled him to calmly slot home his second of the match for his first-ever MLS career brace ...

In just the 17th minute of the match, Olatunji scored his third of what is now four goals in eight games for RSL, streaking in alone on the keeper on a sequence begun by Paraguayan international **Braian Ojeda** ... Olatunji stayed just inside in a perfectly-timed run, taking the centering pass from teenage homegrown **Zavier Gozo** and running to the right post, cutting his low line-drive shot back across goal, past St. Louis GK Roman Bürki ...

Olatunji's opening goal Saturday enabled RSL to score first for the 23rd time in 39 games across all competitions this year, with the draw improving RSL to 11 wins and five draws against seven losses when drawing first blood ... RSL's July 26 home victory over San Jose was its lone come-from-behind win throughout 2025 in MLS reg. season, Leagues Cup and Champions Cup action ...

RSL has now recorded an all-time 46W-10L-18T record when scoring first during the 181-game **Pablo Mastroeni** era, with seven of those 10 first-goal leads conceded for a loss occurring this year ...

MASTROENI MAGIC CONTINUES FOR PLAYOFF PERENNIAL RSL ::

With this year's qualification for the Audi 2025 MLS Cup Playoffs, RSL boss **Pablo Mastroeni** became just the sixth manager out of 205 all-time in the 30-year history of MLS to advance his team to the postseason in each of his first five seasons at the helm ...

The 2-1 win at home back on Sept. 13 against Kansas City snapped a three-game losing streak for RSL, its longest of the year and the longest since August, 2023; since former USMNT star and MLS veteran Mastroeni seized the Claret-and-Cobalt head coaching reins in August, 2021, RSL has dropped consecutive games just 17 times in 181 matches during the Mastroeni era, winning 31 and drawing 16 in games following a loss, including Saturday's draw at St. Louis CITY, again displaying RSL's xDAWG / "bounce-back" resiliency ...

The 3-1 victory at San Diego on April 26 marked Mastroeni's 100th career coaching win across all competitions for the two Rocky Mountain Cup competitors, RSL (2021-present) and Colorado (2014-17) ...

The former U.S. World Cup stalwart has now amassed 108 wins, 121 losses and 81 draws across all competitions for the Utah/Denver-based sides ...

Last June in Kansas City, Mastroeni earned his 50th win across all competitions with RSL in a wild 4-3 road decision, with the 2-0 reg. season win over LA Galaxy on April 5 marking his 50th MLS victory with RSL. Since August, 2021, his arrival in Utah, Mastroeni's all-time RSL coaching record is now 71-65-45 (W-L-T) ...

During each of Pablo's previous three full seasons at the RSL helm, the Club increased its annual point total (47 in 2022, 50 in 2023 and 59 last year), while increasing its Western Conference table position as well (7th in 2022, 5th in 2023 and 3rd last year) ...

The 2024 MLS regular season reached an all-time high of 59 points for RSL, which finished third in the Western Conference and sixth overall in the then-29-team MLS Shield race, while also establishing a new all-time scoring high of 65 goals ...

OPPORTUNITY LOST A WEEK AGO AT SEATTLE ::

Back on Oct. 11, RSL fell 1-0 at Seattle, conceding a fourth-minute goal and surviving an even bigger early hole when Captain and "Iron Man" GK **Rafael Cabral** saved his fourth penalty kick faced in eight attempts this year, denying Jordan Morris from the spot ...

Cabral – the lone 2025 RSL player to have appeared in all 39 games this season across all competitions, registering each and every one of the 3,510 available minutes – has worn the RSL captain's armband for the last 22 matches played since late May ... Late in the Seattle game, an apparent equalizer that saw two attacking substitutes – FW **William Agada** and FW **Victor Olatunji** – knot the match at 1-1 was waved off due to a narrow Olatunji offside call, with both players fined last Tuesday for inappropriate gestures – "twerking" in the ultimately unnecessary goal celebration ...

INTERNATIONAL QUINTET RETURNS TO THE MIX FOR RSL ::

Returning to the Claret-and-Cobalt for the most recent weekend's MLS Decision Day following the FIFA international weekend were three RSL starters who missed the Oct. 11 match in Seattle: playmaker **Diego Luna** (U.S. Men's National Team), holding midfielder **Braian Ojeda** (Paraguay) and teenage winger **Zavier Gozo** (USA U-20) ...

Luna appeared off the bench in both the Oct. 10 1-1 draw with Ecuador in Austin and for the final 60 minutes in last Tuesday's 2-1 comeback win against Australia in suburban Denver, while Ojeda played stoppage time in Paraguay's 2-2 draw in Japan last week before going the full 90 minutes in last Tuesday's 0-2 loss at South Korea ...

Gozo capped off an excellent FIFA World Youth Championship tourney with 67 minutes in the USA U-20 loss to Morocco, finishing with five starts, scoring one goal (game-winner v France) and adding three assists against New Caledonia, France and Italy ...

A pair of RSL internationals also returned this week for the Real Monarchs' MLS NEXT Pro playoff loss against Minnesota Sunday at Zions Bank Stadium in Herriman as defender **Kobi Henry** (Trinidad & Tobago) and **Marcos Zambrano** (USA U-20) were critical additions for Head Coach **Mark Lowry's** fourth-seeded Western Conference team ...

RSL WITH BACK-TO-BACK WINS FOR FIRST TIME SINCE MID-JULY ::

On Oct. 4, RSL defeated Rocky Mountain Cup rival Colorado Rapids, 1-0, as a late first-half goal from Designated Player **Diogo Gonçalves** on newcomer **Rwan Cruz**' debut assist for the Club supported a clean sheet from Captain and GK **Rafael Cabral** to secure RSL's third win in five (only losing twice to LAFC) prior to last week's loss at Seattle, improving the Claret-and-Cobalt record to 8-3-2 (W-L-T) at home since June 1 ...

The back-to-back wins the last two home weekends were RSL's first since mid-July, vaulting RSL back above the playoff line in the West and giving Head Coach **Pablo Mastroeni**'s team control of its postseason destiny entering the final two road matches, during which it snared the necessary away point to keep San Jose and Colorado at bay, advancing with 41 points based on the wins tiebreaker ...

BOUNCE-BACK RESILIENCE RETURNS FOR xDAWG RSL CREW ::

The 2-1 win at home back on Sept. 13 against Kansas City snapped a three-game losing streak for RSL, its longest since August, 2023; since former USMNT star and MLS veteran **Pablo Mastroeni** seized the Claret-and-Cobalt head coaching reins in August, 2021, RSL has dropped consecutive games just 17 times in 180 matches during the Mastroeni era, winning 31 and drawing 15 in games following a loss ...

Saturday in St. Louis, RSL will be looking yet again to display its trademark "xDAWG" resilience in avoiding consecutive losses ...

Back on Sept. 27 v Austin, RSL saw a late first-half goal from Paraguayan international **Braian Ojeda** – his fifth goal across all competitions this season – end a dominant first 45 minutes, while playmaker **Diego Luna** set up second-half strikes from two RSL newcomers: wingback **DeAndre Yedlin** and striker **Victor Olatunji** ...

Luna's assists were his sixth and seventh of 2025, to go along with a Club-high nine MLS goals and 10 across all competitions, eclipsing his previous career-high of eight goals, set last season ...

The late 3-0 lead was RSL's first three-goal lead of 2025, and Olatunji's goal – his second in now six games with RSL since arriving in mid-August – gave RSL three goals in a match for just the second time this season (July 5 in a 3-2 home win over St. Louis) ...

IRON MAN RAFAEL CABRAL CRITICAL CAPTAIN FOR RSL ::

"Iron Man" GK **Rafael Cabral** – a 2025 newcomer to Utah, after 462 professional games played with some of the world's biggest clubs in his native Brazil, England and Italy – has emerged as RSL's Captain and leader, wearing the armband for the last 22 consecutive games since Emeka Eneli's May 24 injury ...

Cabral remains the lone player to start each of RSL's 39 games across multiple competitions this year, playing each and every one of the previous 3,510 minutes of the campaign entering the Seattle trip, including his historic penalty-kick shootout performance in July against Club América ...

With Cabral playing the entirety of the match on Saturday at St. Louis, allowing him to match the most minutes played in an MLS reg. season (3,060, Zac MacMath, 2022) and establish a new all competitions minutes record for RSL's 21-year history (3,510 heading into Wednesday's Wild Card game and perhaps the MLS Cup Playoffs) ...

GOZO GOING OFF FOR USA U-20s ::

Two weeks ago, emerging RSL / USYNT star **Zavier Gozo** was unveiled as the 10th-ranked player in Major League Soccer's annual "22 Under 22" young player class, as voted by an expert panel of MLS coaches, sporting directors, coaches and select media / Apple MLS Season Pass talent ...

His seven goal contributions this season (four goals, three assists) are the most by a teenager in RSL's 21-season MLS history (Luis Gil, five goals, 2013) ...

Back with RSL for Decision Day after missing three consecutive games, RSL's homegrown 18-year-old attacker saw his 2025 FIFA Youth World Cup competition began two weeks ago Monday with two assists in a 67-minute start for the United States U-20s, a 9-1 win over New Caledonia in Chile ...

In the 3-0 win against France, Gozo came off the bench for the final 25 minutes, scoring the game-winning goal in the 85th on a slicing header, assisting on Brooklyn Raines' goal for the 2-0 lead and slamming another shot off the bar late, the rebound finished by Real Monarchs' man **Marcos Zambrano** ...

Gozo, the West Valley-born and Eagle Mountain-raised Utah native provided both assists in a 2-1 home win over Kansas City back on Sept. 13, along with a highlight-reel golazo in the Sept. 17 LAFC loss ...

Gozo's athletic, acrobatic, twisting aerial overhead volley cut LAFC's two-goal lead in half in the 76th minute, earning SportsCenter Top 10 recognition as the #1 overall highlight the following day ...

ROAD IMPROVEMENT NEEDED DOWN THE STRETCH ::

With Saturday's draw at St. Louis during Decision Day, RSL's road record this year improved to 3-9-5 / 14 points across all competitions, underperforming fifth-year head coach Mastroeni's track record, with each of the last two seasons marking the Claret-and-Cobalt's best road campaigns in team history ...

The 2023 side posted an 11W-8L-5T away mark across all competitions, a record which includes both that year's Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup Semifinal loss to Houston, and its road loss and elimination draw in the first and third games of the teams' 2023 Audi MLS Cup Playoff series on the Shell Energy Stadium turf ...

A year ago, Mastroeni's men registered the second-most road points in RSL history, with a 5W-4L-8T MLS reg. season mark, one which does NOT include its heartbreaking, multi-goal Leagues Cup elimination loss to the Dynamo following a home win over Atlas FC ...

HOME REDEMPTION FOR THE POSTSEASON? ::

RSL's win on Oct. 4 improved the Club's home mark to 10-9-3 (W-L-T) on the Wasatch Front thus far this year in MLS, Champions Cup and Leagues Cup matches ...

RSL has now posted an 8-3-2 (W-L-T) home mark across all competitions on Utah soil since June 1, with the possibility of hosting the Western Conference play-in game in Sandy on Oct. 21/22 ...

A year ago, RSL amassed a 12-3-4 (W-L-T) record at home, where the Club has traditionally enjoyed a fortress-like record of success, winning nearly 70% of games and averaging just under two points per game in parts of 17 seasons across all competitions at what is now America First Field ...

Even with a win Wednesday in Portland, RSL's final possible home game of 2025 would occur Sat., Nov. 1 in Sandy, in Leg Two of the Best-of-3 First Round Audi 2025 MLS Cup Playoff series against San Diego ...

SPORTING WIN SNAPS THREE-GAME SLIDE FOR RSL ::

In the home win back on Sept. 13 against Kansas City, RSL welcomed the return of three perennial 2025 starters – **Diego Luna** (USA), **Braian Ojeda** (Paraguay) and **Zavier Gozo** (USA U-20) – from international duty, with Luna scoring the game's opening goal and 18-year-old Utah native Gozo securing his first-ever multi-assist match, providing assists on both goals, including the 62nd-minute game-winner from DF **Alex Katranis** ...

Luna returned to play for the first time ever with both new RSL roster additions **Victor Olatunji** and **Rwan Cruz**, while the Club's newest player, MLS veteran and former USMNT standout **DeAndre Yedlin** is expected to return to action this week after serving a caution accumulation suspension Saturday ...

The Luna goal that Saturday gave the 22-year-old MLS All-Star a Club-best ninth goal on the current MLS season, to go with now seven assists after his second-half "double" against Austin ... Luna also provided one goal in RSL's Leagues Cup trio of matches, his 10 goals across all competitions this season eclipsing his previous career-high of eight goals, set last season ...

LUNA BACK WITH RSL FOR FIRST TIME IN A MONTH ::

With the late red card (second yellow) received August 10 at Red Bulls, RSL's leading scorer (10 total goals this season), USMNT star and two-time MLS All-Star **Diego Luna** served the second of his two-game suspension back on Aug. 23 against Minnesota ... The Aug. 16 match at Charlotte saw Luna serve the red-card portion of his suspension, with the home match missed due to his caution earlier on Aug. 10, a dissent yellow which marked his fifth caution of the year following the first of two penalties called last against RSL on the dirt patch in Harrison, N.J. ...

Luna started one and came off the bench in the other USMNT September friendlies against Korea and Japan, finally returning to action for RSL Saturday against Kansas City at America First Field ...

FW **William Agada** and FW **Zavier Gozo** also returned to RSL this past week, after serving caution accumulation suspensions after receiving their fifth yellows Aug. 16 in Charlotte ...

“IRON MAN” RAFA CABRAL EARNS CONTRACT EXTENSION ::

A month ago Thursday, RSL announced that the Club has extended the contract for Captain and 2025 “Iron Man” GK **Rafael Cabral**, the 35-year-old Brazilian who has played every minute of every one of RSL’s 37 games across three competitions this season ...

Cabral, the 2011 Copa Libertadores winner who spent nearly a decade in Italy and England prior to his Brazil return two years ago, is now signed through the 2027 Major League Soccer season, with a Club option for the 2028 MLS season ...

With nine clean sheets this season (seven in MLS, one in Concacaf Champions Cup and another in Leagues Cup), Cabral has also been fantastic when facing penalties, saving multiple regulation attempts and standing tall in the tiebreakers, especially against Club América in late July ...

“This Club – the way they treat us and our family, at the game, at the facility, it truly makes a difference – we are so comfortable and happy, me and my wife and my kids,” said Cabral about the decision to extend his commitment to Real Salt Lake. “My family is my fuel, everything I do is for them, I am blessed to have them with me; seeing them enjoy Utah makes everything for me so easy, its been unbelievable, so so nice, the Club has helped us so much, we are very happy and grateful.

“I believe we are able to make the playoffs and win a trophy,” continued Cabral. “I’m here every day, we are working hard, we have amazing players and more importantly, amazing human beings in a great environment, an environment based on respect. This is why I believe in this locker room; the way we fight, the way we compete for each other, we are like a family.

“I do not force anything, when I have to say something, I will say it,” responds Cabral when asked about his leadership style. “I’m here to help, and a big part of leadership is being a good listener – I’m honest, I speak from heart, I share what I feel, I’m just being myself. I’m here to help Pablo (Mastroeni) and make his job easier, we trust each other and we have a relationship based on honesty – its important to always share what you think in order to help the group.

“I like to speak to the young players about helping them reach their dreams, what are they going through, I share stories from my past but I don’t like to talk about myself. I just try to always be available to help everyone, they help me as well – most of them have

same dreams I’ve had before, its about being available to them for whatever they need ...

“We are loving living here and the fans make such a big impact on us; the fans here love sports, the environment, the stadium is always sold out, they are polite and recognize our effort, every time we go on the pitch we want to represent them and reward their efforts to buy tickets, to travel to games, to wear the jersey, so we want to make them proud.”

“The moment we walk out the tunnel and see the fans, hear the fans on the pitch, it’s the moment I like the most; you are grateful to play soccer, its my dream, my kids dream, we train all week and work hard for that moment.”

Born May 20, 1990 in Sorocaba, Sao Paulo, Brazil, Cabral has played 375 professional games since turning professional in 2010, coming up through the legendary Santos youth academy before appearing in 151 games for the club famous for producing both Pelé and Neymar, amongst other world figures. With Santos, Cabral won the prestigious Copa Libertadores South American club competition in 2011 ... A year later, Cabral featured between the pipes with both the Brazil National Team and the Brazil Olympic Team, making his senior team debut in a 4-1 win over the United States just prior to the London Olympic Games ...

The summer of 2013 saw Cabral purchased by Napoli for more than \$5 million, making his debut for the Serie A club in a UEFA Champions League match against Arsenal, delivering the clean sheet, in a 2-0 win ... Following five seasons in Italy with Napoli and Sampdoria, with whom Cabral won both the Coppa Italia and the Italian SuperCup despite playing just 45 games from 2013-19, the Brazilian netminder moved on to England with Championship side Reading, for whom he was named the club’s 2019/20 Player of the Season, the highlight of his 98 appearances across all competitions ...

“Rafa has been a steady, experienced presence for our goalkeeping group, and his leadership on and off the field has been outstanding,” said RSL Chief Soccer Officer **Kurt Schmid**, now wrapping up his fifth year in Utah. “His composure with the ball, sharp shot-stopping, and ability to organize the defense have been crucial in key moments this season. We’re very pleased to keep Rafa in Utah, where his consistency and professionalism continue to make him an integral part of our club’s success.”

The last three years prior to his arrival in Utah have seen Cabral appear for Brazilian side Cruzeiro in 120 matches, with the 6-foot-2, 190-lb goalkeeper on loan

to Gremio – for whom he made just six appearances in the second half of 2024 – prior to his January, 2025 move to Major League Soccer and Real Salt Lake ...

NEWEST ACQUISITION DeANDRE YEDLIN OPENS RSL ACCOUNT ::

RSL's newest acquisition, defender/wingback **DeAndre Yedlin** (pronounced day – AHN – dray), scored his first RSL goal Sept. 27, the game-winner in a 3-1 win over Austin ...

The early second-half goal was Yedlin's fifth in now 225 MLS games played with Seattle, Miami, Cincinnati and RSL ...

Back in late August, Yedlin arrived in Utah and got two training sessions at altitude under his belt prior to making his debut on Saturday, Aug. 23 at home against Minnesota United FC ... However, Yedlin was forced to miss the Sept. 13 Kansas City match due to caution accumulation, taking a late yellow in the 1-3 loss to Minnesota ...

Here's some things you should know about DeAndre as we welcome him to Utah:

- 1) Yedlin is a veteran of 223 career MLS matches including his now five on the Wasatch Front, amassing that total with Seattle (2013/14), Inter Miami (2022-24) and Cincinnati (2024/25), scoring five career goals in the U.S. / Canada-based setup from his usual right back / right wingback position.
- 2) A three-time MLS All-Star (2013, 2014, 2022), Yedlin also served as club Captain for Inter Miami's 2023 Leagues Cup championship team, ceding the honor to Lionel Messi upon his late-season arrival. As a second-year professional, Yedlin also raised the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup with Seattle in 2014.
- 3) Yedlin also scored four times while playing 187 games of European football from early 2015 to January 2022. Yedlin's European totals include 151 games in England with Newcastle – whom he helped gain promotion in the 2016/17 campaign – as well as Sunderland and Tottenham, prior to a 36-game career with Turkish power Galatasaray in 2021/22.
- 4) Born on July 9, 1993 as DeAndre Roselle Yedlin in Seattle, Wash., the former Crossfire Premier player became Seattle Sounders FC's first-ever homegrown signing, returning to his hometown after attending the University of Akron for two seasons (2011/12). RSL's penultimate MLS match

of the season sees a return for Yedlin and his new Club on Sat., Oct. 11 at Lumen Field, site of significant glory for both Yedlin individually and RSL collectively (MLS Cup 2009 victory).

- 5) Yedlin is a two-time FIFA World Cup selection (2014 & 2022), boasting 81 caps with the U.S. Men's National Team over a decade-long span from 2014 to 2023, earning notoriety as the youngest USMNT player at the 2014 FIFA World Cup in Brazil, where he was teammates with then-active Claret-and-Cobalt icons **Kyle Beckerman** and **Nick Rimando**.
- 6) Yedlin, who will wear jersey No. 2 for RSL this season, joins nine other RSL players to own FIFA World Cup appearances on their career resume, with **Eddie Pope** (2006), **Robbie Findley** (2010), Rimando (2014) and Beckerman (2014) also representing the United States. Former RSL midfielder **Andy Williams** (Jamaica, 1998), **Douglas Sequiera** (Costa Rica, 2006), **Alvaro Saborio** (Costa Rica, 2010/14), **Carlos Salcedo** (Mexico, 2018) and **Bryan Oviedo** (Costa Rica, 2018/2022) also competed for their home nations in the globe's largest event. Pope, Findley, Rimando, Beckerman and Oviedo each participated in the quadrennial event while an active member of RSL, while Saborio saw his 2014 bid cut short due to a pre-tourney knee injury.
- 7) Only eight players in Real Salt Lake history have played more games in Europe than Yedlin's 187 – Alfredo Ortuño (511), Nedum Onuoha (354), fellow 2025 addition **Johnny Russell** (334), Damir Kreilach (277), Giuseppe Rossi (268), Bobby Wood (230), new teammate **Diogo Gonçalves** (219) and Everton Luiz (204).
- 8) Yedlin has ties to the Claret-and-Cobalt, connections spanning his youth, MLS and international careers. In his own words: "RSL is an historic club in MLS, with an amazing reputation around the League," said Yedlin from the airport on Wednesday night, prior to his arrival at Salt Lake City International Airport. "I've played with two of the Club's iconic people, **Nick Rimando** and **Kyle Beckerman**, and I was coached by **Jason Kreis** in Miami. I've known (Chief Soccer Officer) **Kurt Schmid** since my Seattle days, (Director of Recruitment) **Jon Spencer** is a family friend. (Head Coach) **Pablo Mastroeni's** reputation is excellent with his track record of success on and off the pitch. The culture they've built there is outstanding."
- 9) Yedlin was the 13th debutant for RSL this season when he debuted against Minnesota on Aug. 23, joining GK **Rafael Cabral**, DF **Kobi Henry**, FW

Forster Ajago, FW **Ari Piol**, DF **Sam Junqua**, MF **Tyler Wolff**, FW **Jesus Barea**, FW **William Agada**, FW **Johnny Russell**, MF **Aiden Hezarkhani**, FW **Rwan Cruz** and FW **Victor Olatunji**.

- 10) With 12 hours remaining in the secondary MLS transfer period, Yedlin became the fourth player to be added to Real Salt Lake's roster in the 2025 summer window, joining USA U20 **Marcos Zambrano** (free agent after three years in Portugal), Brazilian FW **Rwan Cruz** (added via loan from Botafogo in Brazil August 1) and Nigerian FW **Victor Olatunji** (transfer from Sparta Prague on August 6) ...
- 11) Yedlin expressed excitement and opportunity to get back to the Western geography of the U.S. Again, in his words: "My family is excited for the move, looking forward to living in the mountains, which will be a whole different world with the nature there," added Yedlin, father of two young children. "I'm excited to get back to the West, as I've always felt at home in the mountains, my grandfather and I used to go hiking a lot when I was a child. I find them very calming and relaxing. My wife is from The Bronx, and she cannot wait."
- 12) Yedlin, an advocate for meditation and the act of "grounding" to re-center oneself, has also become a voracious reader off the field late in his career. Other off-field passions also include exploring his artistic side, typically through clothing design – Yedlin hopes to create a capsule collection with RSL, much like he did previously in Cincinnati – while also pursuing various environmental endeavors, primarily through his recyclable/vegan **Sokito** brand football boots.

RSL ADDS DP STRIKER RWAN CRUZ VIA BOTAFOGO LOAN ::

On Friday, August 1, Real Salt Lake announced it has acquired 24-year-old Brazilian striker **Rwan Cruz** (pronounced JUAN) via loan from Botafogo (Brazilian Série A) to Utah's Major League Soccer Club through June 30, 2026, with an option to extend through the 2026 season ... RSL also have a purchase option at a predetermined price to be exercised at any point during the loan period ...

Cruz – considered a Designated Player for RSL's 2025 roster designation – received his P-1 work visa on Wednesday morning, Aug. 6, and ended up playing the final 25 minutes of the 1-0 win over Queretaro ...

With his first-ever start for RSL last weekend in Charlotte coming after making his Aug. 10 debut MLS against the Red Bulls, Cruz became the 225th player in RSL's 21-year MLS reg. season history ...

Born in Jaboatão dos Guararapes, a suburb of Recife, Brazil, on May 20, 2001, the 24-year-old **Rwan Philippe Rodrigues de Souza Cruz**, scored 24 goals in 50 leagues games over 18 months from July 2023 to February 2025 at Ludogorets Razgrad in Bulgaria, while adding a goal and four assists in UEFA competitions ...

A \$10 million Botafogo transfer brought him back to his native Brazil this February, with the imposing and quick 6-foot-2 attacker scoring seven goals in 53 games with Santos, Vasco da Gama and Botafogo on either side of his European experience ...

Cruz traveled with Botafogo and former RSL player **Jefferson Savarino** for the FIFA Club World Cup earlier this summer, but did not appear in the competition.

"I am excited to arrive in Utah and I look forward to integrating with the family here at the Club," said Cruz, who wears Claret-and-Cobalt jersey No. 12. "I have been watching the RSL games and I think we play very well as a team. We have a playing style with short passing combinations that I enjoy very much, and I believe this is an excellent fit for me.

"I have received good references for this Club, and that motivated me to be here today; everything happens for a reason and I believe it is of great significance at the right time for me to be in Utah. I am very happy."

"The fans are our 12th player and we depend a lot on them. The energy that comes from them motivates us, they are important each and every game. I have felt and seen the atmosphere in the stadium for both the San Jose and Club América games, it was influential in our ability to turn these games around. Again, the fans are very important to us and they can expect me to bring competitiveness every moment I am on the pitch, and I am arriving to add to and strengthen the group by scoring many goals and assists."

The son of a bricklayer, Cruz made his professional debut with legendary Brazilian club Santos in February, 2022, at the age of 18 in a home loss to São Paulo, scoring his first professional goal three days later in a Copa do Brasil away win at Salgueiro ... This season with Botafogo, Cruz scored two goals in 16 matches across five competitions, including a prestigious Copa Libertadores goal in a 3-2 home victory of Estudiantes this May ...

RSL ALSO ADDING NIGERIAN STRIKER VICTOR OLATUNJI ::

On August 6, Real Salt Lake announced it has acquired 25-year-old Nigerian striker **Victor Olatunji** via permanent transfer from Sparta Prague (Czech 1.Liga) to Utah's Major League Soccer Club through June of the 2028 season, with RSL also having Club options for the remainder of 2028 and all of the 2029 MLS campaign ... RSL acquired the Discovery Priority to sign Olatunji – billed by some as the “new-age Benteke” – from D.C. United in exchange for \$125,000 in 2026 General Allocation Money (GAM) ...

With the Aug. 14 receipt of his P-1 work visa, Olatunji – considered a TAM Player for RSL's 2025 roster designation – became eligible to appear for RSL in MLS reg. season action at Charlotte FC, where he started and went the full 90 minutes, prior to scoring his debut RSL/MLS goal, a first-half equalizer against Minnesota ...

MORE OLATUNJI ::

Born in Sokoto, Nigeria on September 5, 1999, the 25-year old **Victor Oluyemi Olatunji** has scored 20 goals in his 93 games with Sparta Prague across all competitions in the last two calendar years from July, 2023, through late July ...

For six different clubs after turning professional as an 18-year-old in late 2017, Olatunji had scored 43 goals in 105 games while playing in Slovakia, Austria, Cyprus and the Czech Republic prior to his Sparta Prague move ...

“I very much look forward to playing in Utah and in America,” said Olatunji, who will wear Claret-and-Cobalt jersey No. 17. “I have seen and heard good things about Real Salt Lake, the whole setup, and this inspires me to be here today.

“I am excited to meet the fans, they are very important to every club and ours can now expect me to play my hardest, bring hard work and desire to the game, and I also hope to help my team with goals and assists and whatever is asked of me.”

During his two years at Sparta Prague, Olatunji helped win two trophies – the league title in 2023/24 and that same season's Czech Cup – while scoring six goals in 14 UEFA Champions League matches (four in nine qualifying games, two in six proper tournament matches) ... Olatunji boasts several landmark goals for the Czech club, including the fourth goal in the 87th minute of a 4-1 comeback (5-4 aggregate) against Dinamo Zagreb in order to qualify for

the 2023–24 UEFA Europa League. He also scored the second goal in 3-0 UEFA Champions League group stage win against Red Bull Salzburg on Sept. 18, 2024, also providing an assist on the third goal of the match, the third African player and the first-ever Nigerian to score and assist in his Champions League debut ... Last November, Olatunji scored Prague's lone goal in a 1-2 defeat to Brest in UEFA Champions League ...

“We are excited to welcome Victor to Utah, another move we've been working on for some time,” said RSL's Chief Soccer Officer **Kurt Schmid**, noting the current window's additions of Brazilian **Rwan Cruz** and USA U-20 forward **Marcos Zambrano** ... “Victor's speed, strength and intelligence in the box should allow him to fit into our attack.”

The 6-foot-4 striker becomes the third Nigerian-born player to call Utah his Major League Soccer home, joining current FW **William Agada** – who has scored three goals in 17 games since arriving via trade in April from Sporting Kansas City – and former midfielder **Sunday “Sunny” Stephen**, who played 64 games for RSL from the 2016-18 seasons ... Current RSL Captain **Emeka Eneli** – who has played 92 games in three seasons since his rookie 2023 year – is also of Nigerian heritage ...

LEAGUES CUP PHASE ONE COMPLETED, NO ADVANCEMENT DESPITE UNDEFEATED RECORD ::

Real Salt Lake completed its 2025 Leagues Cup Phase One with six points from its three games, with one regulation victory (Aug. 6 v Queretaro) and a pair of 2-2 regulation draws against Club América (3-1 PK shootout win) and Atlético San Luis (1-4 PK shootout loss) ...

RSL finished tied for sixth amongst the 18 MLS teams in this year's Leagues Cup with those six points ...

On Utah soil against Mexican visitors, RSL now owns an all-time 6W-6L-5T mark, including three wins (Queretaro, Atlas, León), a loss (Monterrey) and a pair of 2-2 regulation draws against continental power Club América and visiting Atlético San Luis in the last three Leagues Cup tournaments ...

Paraguayan midfielder **Braian Ojeda** led the Utah side with three of its five goals in the tournament, scoring a brace against San Luis last Aug. 2 prior to providing the game-winner against Queretaro ... MF **Diego Luna** and FW **William Agada** also scored in the tourney, both in the first half against Club América ...

In the July 30 tournament opener, the Utah side allowed a last-gasp 97+ equalizer to pre-tourney favorite Club América before 19,544 fans at America First Field, setting the stage for a penalty-kick tiebreaker ... RSL Captain and goalkeeper **Rafael Cabral** earned Man of the Match honors with a heroic eight-save performance, including stops on three of four PK attempts faced, while Claret-and-Cobalt men **Pablo Ruiz**, **Justen Glad** and **Bryan Vera** converted their attempts to secure two points in the Leagues Cup table ...

RED-HOT OJEDA SUDDENLY FINDING BACK OF NET::

Ojeda's recent goal-scoring spate has seen him find the back of the net four times in the four games prior to the three losses at New York / Charlotte / v Minnesota, the Paraguayan international now up to six goals in a Claret-and-Cobalt kit after scoring only twice in his first 75 games all competitions, also adding the July 26 game-winner against San Jose ...

The Aug. 6 game-winner against Queretaro saw Ojeda – a newly-minted green card holder – cut back to his right from 25 yards out and send a sizzling curler far post, the ball dipping just under the bar into the upper 90 to stun both the crowd and the opponent ...

On August 2 against Atlético San Luis, Ojeda put RSL up early with a ninth-minute, far-post corner-kick conversion, slamming home the Pablo Ruiz offering, later equalizing at the death with a curling 88th-minute offering after RSL had surrendered its lead by conceding two goals against the run of play ...

CABR-WALL OF WASATCH ::

RSL GK **Rafael Cabral** impressed greatly with three saves in four attempts faced in that July 30 shootout against Mexican power América ...

Not only was the tiebreaker win RSL's first since a second-leg MLS Cup Playoff shootout win against Houston – RSL dropping three straight PK deciders since (Leg 3 2023 @ HOU, Legs 1 and 2 in 2024 v MIN), it marked RSL's second-ever 3-1 / 4-round shootout win, and its first since a 2016 Open Cup home match against Wilmington Hammerheads with **Jeff Attinella** in goal ...

Iconic RSL goalkeeper and newly-inducted Hall of Famer **Nick Rimando** famously made three saves in a trio of MLS Cup Playoff shootouts for RSL, including two in 2009 – the East Final at Chicago (7 attempts faced), and the Cup v LA Galaxy at Seattle (also 7 attempts faced) ...

In RSL's MLS Cup 2013 loss at Kansas City, a 20-round affair that saw Rimando face 10 attempts, he also had three saves ...

FIREWORKS CELEBRATIONS ::

The late 2-1 win against the Earthquakes on July 26 added to RSL's historic dominance on Pioneer Day Weekend, with nine wins and five draws against just four losses in its previous 20 seasons ... Earlier this month, RSL improved to eight wins, nine draws against just two losses all-time in its Fourth of July / Independence Day celebrations with a 3-2 win over St. Louis CITY SC, improving RSL's record on the two holidays complete with post-game fireworks shows to a combined 17W-6L-9T on Utah soil ...

SETTING THE STANDARD FOR IMPROVEMENT EVERY YEAR ::

During each of Pablo's previous three full seasons at the RSL helm, the Club has increased its annual point total (47 in 2022, 50 in 2023 and 59 last year), while increasing its Western Conference table position as well (7th in 2022, 5th in 2023 and 3rd last year) ... The 2025 campaign features RSL's pursuit of a Conference-best fifth consecutive postseason berth, a seventh in the last eight seasons and its 15th in the last 18 years ...

Last year saw RSL advance to the MLS Cup Playoffs for a fourth consecutive occasion, the sixth time in seven seasons (2020 the lone exception), and for the 14th time in the last 17 seasons since first qualifying in 2008 (2015, 2017 the other outliers) ...

The 2024 MLS regular season reached an all-time high of 59 points for RSL, which finished third in the Western Conference and sixth overall in the then-29-team MLS Shield race, while also establishing a new all-time scoring high of 65 goals ...

That 3-1 victory at San Diego on April 26 also marked Head Coach **Pablo Mastroeni's** 100th career coaching win across all competitions for the two Rocky Mountain Cup competitors, RSL (2021-present) and Colorado (2014-17) ... The former U.S. World Cup stalwart has now amassed 106 wins, 121 losses and 80 draws across all competitions for the Utah/Denver-based sides ... Last June in Kansas City, Mastroeni earned his 50th win across all competitions with RSL in a wild 4-3 road decision, with the 2-0 reg. season win over LA Galaxy on April 5 marking his 50th MLS victory with RSL

...

Since his August, 2021 arrival in Utah, Mastroeni's all-time coaching record is now 71-65-44 (W-L-T) ...

LUNA STAR SHINING BRIGHTLY ::

Real Salt Lake standout **Diego Luna** recently became the shining star of the U.S. run to the Gold Cup Final July 6 against Mexico, with the third-year RSL player scoring three goals and adding two assists in the previous two games against Costa Rica (first-ever USMNT goal) and Guatemala (15-minute brace to open game) ...

The Sunnyvale, CA native and 2025 leading scorer for RSL (9 goals, 5 assists in 22 MLS games, with a ninth Leagues Cup goal, despite a missed penalty kick opportunity in regulation against San Luis), Luna was named an MLS All-Star for the second consecutive year in late June ... July 23 in Austin, Luna played 45 second-half minutes to join fellow United States Men's National Team standouts Max Arfsten, Sebastian Berhalter, Alex Freeman, Miles Robinson and Brian White among 26 players unveiled for the 2025 MLS All-Star Game roster ...

Luna – one of 12 players named 2025 All-Stars through a combination of fan / player / media voting – became the first Real Salt Lake All-Star named to the team in back-to-back years in nearly a decade, repeating the feat accomplished by Hall of Famer **Nick Rimando** in the 2014/15 seasons ...

Rimando and former Claret-and-Cobalt Captain **Kyle Beckerman** each appeared in three consecutive MLS All-Star Games at various junctures, while **Will Johnson** was selected in the 2013/14 editions ...

The 21-year-old Luna leads Real Salt Lake with nine MLS goals and five assists this 2025 MLS season, matching his total goal output from a year ago ...

Impressing USMNT boss **Mauricio Pochettino** with his January camp performance, Luna distinguished himself during the March Nations League window for the Stars-and-Stripes before locking in as the team's passionate playmaker and emotional leader during the recent Gold Cup ...

NELSON PALACIO OUT ON LOAN TO FC ZURICH ::

Due to the Braian Ojeda green card absence over most of June, holding midfielder **Nelson Palacio** started and played the full 90 in each of the four contests prior to July 12 v. Houston, the U22 Colombian making consecutive starts for the first time in his two seasons with Real Salt Lake ...

However, in mid-July Palacio was loaned to FC Zurich of the Swiss SuperLeague through summer 2026, freeing up an international spot and a U22 roster designation for RSL ahead of the upcoming transfer window, which opens July 24 ...

Palacio arrived in Utah in the summer of 2023, via permanent transfer from Atlético Nacional in his home country, appearing in 48 Major League Soccer regular- and post-season matches, along with another 10 combined appearances in CONCACAF Champions Cup, the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, Leagues Cup and MLS NEXT Pro competitions.

Palacio, 24, has occupied one of RSL's four U22 roster designations during the past three seasons, scoring two goals, both in dramatic fashion during the 2024 Claret-and-Cobalt campaign (one the Leagues Cup game-winning ZAPATAZO in the 71st-minute against Atlas FC (Liga MX), the other a late-game equalizer that completed an 0-3 comeback to rescue a point at Dallas) ...

LUNA LUMINESCENT YET AGAIN ::

Through 33 games across all competitions thus far in 2025, RSL has scored only 37 goals thus far, with 40% of the production – 10 goals and 5 assists – coming from emerging RSL / USMNT starlet **Diego Luna** ...

Diego is now joined by **Diogo Gonçalves**, **William Agada** and **Zavier Gozo** (3 MLS goals each), as well as **Johnny Russell** (2 goals) as RSL players with multiple goals) this season, with Luna seeing his four-goal-in-three-game streak snapped with the 0-0 draw in mid-May against Portland ... Luna returned against Houston on July 12 looking to build upon his octet of goals, equaling his 2024 total of eight, a campaign that earned him MLS All-Star and Young Player of the Year honors ...

Luna's stoppage-time, last-gasp conversion from the penalty spot at Vancouver May 3 rescued RSL from a sixth shutout suffered in these 26 games played in MLS / CCC competition this year (it eventually came July 19 v Cincinnati) ...

Luna has a pair of two-goal braces thus far, scoring both goals in a 2-0 home win over LA Galaxy on April 5 and the first two – including a game-winning PK – in the 3-1 April 26 win at San Diego ...

MONARCHS PROOF OF CONCEPT ::

In a 4-1 Real Monarchs MLS NEXT Pro win over Portland at home on May 28, 21-year-old RSL attacker **Tyler Wolff** provided two goals – including the game-winner – as well as two assists in a complete performance ...

Due to his excellent exhibition and seizing the opportunity for extended minutes, Wolff rejoined RSL the next day in Los Angeles and was available off the bench as part of the 20-man MLS roster after a three-game hiatus ...

Despite several recent inclusions in the first-team Leagues Cup roster, five RSL players – DF **Kobi Henry**, Homegrowns FW **Aiden Hezarkhani**, MF **Owen Anderson**, D/M **Omar Marquez** and rookie FW **Jesus Barea** – were with the Monarchs Friday at LAFC 2 ...

Barea scored the dagger in the 3-1 win for his team-high eighth goal in 15 games with the MLS NEXT Pro side, while rookie **Ruben Mesalles** headed home the critical late goal that gave Head Coach **Mark Lowry**'s side a 2-0 lead ...

It was **Marcos Zambrano**'s early conversion of a turnover in the first 30 seconds that put the Monarchs on the front foot – his fifth goal in eight games – en route to its first-ever MLS NEXT Pro playoff clinch ...

EMOTIONAL ROLLERCOASTER MAY 24 v VANCOUVER ::

In its home game back on May 24, America First Field in Sandy was buzzing when RSL scored two goals in the first four minutes of the match, as 18-year-old **Zavier Gozo** found the back of the net just 50 seconds after the opening whistle ... Assisted by RSL and U.S. Men's National Team starlet **Diego Luna** on the play, Gozo – at the time just 18 years, 63 days, just 48 hours after graduating high school the Thursday prior – became the third youngest scorer in Club history (Luis Gil, Freddy Adu) ...

When Luna reacted quickly to rebound in the box to put RSL up 2-0 in the fourth minute – for his team-high eighth goal of the year, equaling his 2024 MLS All-Star and MLS Young Player of the Year output – it marked the first time in the Claret-and-Cobalt's now 664-game MLS history over 21 regular seasons that RSL scored twice in the first five minutes, and just the second time ever RSL scored twice inside the opening 10 ... MLS last saw a team go up 2-0 in the first 300 seconds back in 2018 (New York Red Bulls vs. NYCFC) ...

However, a resolute Vancouver side had the game back on level terms midway through the first half on a Brian White brace, first scoring on a headed corner kick in the 20th minute, then equalizing from the penalty spot in the 25th after RSL striker William Agada unknowingly had the ball glance off the back of his arm ...

Deadlocked for another hour-plus, the visiting Whitecaps stole all three points at their former 2021 home with a curling shot far post by Pedro Vite ...

AGADA DEBUT START IGNOMINIUS AT DALLAS ::

Nearly 12 weeks ago at Dallas saw the first-ever Claret-and-Cobalt start for 25-year-old FW **William Agada**, who was acquired April 23 from Sporting Kansas City at the close of the primary MLS transfer window ...

Agada's 60+ minutes in Dallas May 10 were marred by a second yellow with just under a half-hour left, adjudged to have simulated a dive in the penalty box ... William was suspended midweek against Portland, but returned to the XI May 17 at Colorado ...

The Nigerian-born striker did make his Club debut April 26 in San Diego, playing the final 23 minutes off the bench to become the 222nd all-time RSL player during its 21 Major League Soccer seasons ... Several weeks ago in Vancouver, Agada played the final 45 minutes, coming on at halftime for young Australian striker **Ari Piol**, who has started seven games thus far in his first-ever MLS season ...

Back to Agada – the Nigerian-born striker now wears the No. 9 shirt for RSL, paying homage to Club legend Jason Kreis (also worn by Justin Meram, Chicho Arango), now in his eighth season as a professional, having scored 65 goals in 218 career games, including 24 goals in 78 games across all competitions with Sporting KC since his U.S. arrival ... Nearly three summers ago, Agada joined Sporting KC in a transfer from Israeli side Hapoel Jerusalem (June 2022) ...

SAN DIEGO REVENGE GAME ::

RSL's 3-1 win April 26 at Snapdragon Stadium marked the expansion side's first-ever home loss, reversing the result from March 8 at America First Field, when RSL dropped a 1-3 decision in a match that featured FW **Ari Piol**'s first RSL / MLS goal as well as two stoppage-time scores for San Diego ...

On April 26, the Claret-and-Cobalt rode another **Diego Luna** brace to victory, with substitute DF **Sam Junqua** providing the insurance dagger ... Luna's goals 10 minutes apart on either side of halftime – each one giving RSL the lead – enabled RSL to score three goals for the first time since Sept., 2024, against Portland, a span of 17 games ...

LUNA CARD RESCINDED ::

Luna's two-goal performance at San Diego – his second of the season (April 5 v LA Galaxy) and the third of his career (July 2023 v NYCFC) – came after an independent panel unanimously decided to rescind the one-game suspension and accompanying fine for the red card issued to **Diego Luna** in the 61st minute of the 0-1 loss

against Toronto FC on April 19 ... The Independent Review Panel – consisting of one representative from the U.S. Soccer Federation, one representative from the Canadian Soccer Association and one independent representative nominated by the Professional Referee Organization, determined that Luna was eligible to play at San Diego ...

RSL's successful appeal of the decision – a controversial one that also saw Luna fined for not leaving the field during the VAR determination – enables the Club to retain its two potential appeal opportunities for the 2025 campaign ...

JUNQUA WITH THE DAGGER ::

Just a quarter-hour into the San Diego win, RSL was forced to bring versatile left-sided DF **Sam Junqua** off the bench, replacing a concussed centerback **Brayan Vera** (who remains out for a second consecutive week after surviving the collision with teammate and GK **Rafael Cabral**), remaining in concussion protocol ahead of the Dallas match ...

Junqua entered the RSL defensive back four as the left centerback between **Alex Katranis** and **Philip Quinton**, adding the insurance dagger midway through the second half with his seventh career MLS goal in 146 career professional games played ... Junqua's first-ever RSL goal was from 25-yards out, a low laser to the far post from the left side ...

The former Houston / Dallas defender had spent much of preseason alongside Quinton as the fourth centerback or backup left-sided wingback, as RSL HC **Pablo Mastroeni** platooned two groups in February as RSL juggled both CONCACAF Champions Cup and Major League Soccer action ...

NASHVILLE NIGHTMARE ::

RSL blasted off to an early lead two months ago at Geodis Park in Nashville, with Polish international winger **Dominik Marczuk** slotting home the rebound of a **Diogo Gonçalves** shot from distance for a 12th-minute lead ...

Minutes later, Marczuk was elbowed in the face/neck area by Nashville DF Daniel Lovitz – with a VAR review recommendation to center referee Jair Marrufo – but only yellow was given ... Lovitz proceeded to equalize off a set piece just minutes later, and the teams entered the halftime break tied 1-1 ...

Against the run of play in a second half dominated by the home side, RSL looked to retake the lead as Gonçalves set up Marczuk on the right side, squaring the ball to rookie **Jesus Barea** for his debut professional goal, but Marczuk was called offside in his phase to nullify the advantage ...

RSL was then doomed in second-half stoppage, as DF **Nelson Palacio** was whistled for an extremely soft foul in the box on Hany Mukhtar, with Sam Sturridge slotting home the penalty for a 2-1 home win ...

LUNA SHINING BRIGHTLY ::

For the third time this season, RSL playmaker **Diego Luna** was recognized by Major League Soccer for his weekend heroics at San Diego, again named to Matchday 10's fictional XI ...

In the April 5 matinee in Sandy, Luna needed just five minutes midway through the first half to bag his second career brace, leading RSL to a 2-0 lead, one which would hold for the final result against the reigning MLS Cup champion LA Galaxy as the Claret-and-Cobalt snapped a two-game slide ...

Quite the eventful weekend culminated with the MLS honor for Luna, as the 21-year-old was recognized that Friday night by the Utah Sports Commission – an extension of the Governor's office as part of Utah's "State of Sport" proclamation – as the 2024 Male Professional Athlete of the Year ... Luna – also the reigning 2024 MLS Young Player of the Year – earned an assist as well as the game-winning goal for RSL in its last win, a 2-1 victory on March 15 in Houston ...

LUNA ENJOYING LIMELIGHT ::

With family from California and Texas in tow to both the Friday awards ceremony and the April 5 matinee, perhaps it was the presence of another guest – U.S. Men's National Team assistant coach Miguel D'Agostino, in town to watch Luna and January USMNT teammate **Emeka Eneli** ahead of this summer's Gold Cup – who provided additional inspiration for Luna, who now has five goals and two assists in his last five RSL matches ...

With the brace April 5, Luna became the youngest player in RSL history (21 years, 208 days) to amass 15 goals AND 15 assists in his career on the Wasatch Front ...

The two-goal performances in April were Luna's second- and third-ever, his first arriving back on July 15, 2023, against the New York Red Bulls just ahead of his departure to represent the U.S. in that summer's FIFA World Youth Championships in Argentina ...

Following the April 12 trip, Luna spent the weekend at Coachella with Travis Scott, appearing backstage via Nike invitation, and then hit the Hollywood red carpet Monday with actor Diego Luna for the Andor Season Two premiere ...

LOONY RESULT AT ALLIANZ ::

March 29 at Minnesota, Real Salt Lake fell, 2-0 at Minnesota in an icy monsoon, conceding goals on either side of halftime three weeks ago ... Two turnovers while pushing high saw RSL concede transition opportunities to the host Loons, whose victory snapped a six-game run of draws between the teams across multiple competitions in 2023 and 2024 ...

RSL boss **Pablo Mastroeni** made four changes at halftime, two tactical and two due to the hypothermic conditions in rain, wind and sleet in St. Paul ...

ROAD WIN AT HOUSTON IN MARCH ::

Nearly three months ago on the road, RSL snapped a nine-game road winless run against the Dynamo in Houston (dating back to 2018), posting a 2-1 victory that saw both of the Club's premier playmakers, **Diogo Gonçalves** and **Diego Luna**, score first-half goals on either side of the Houston equalizer ... Just 43 seconds into the match, Diogo found the back of the net with the fourth-fastest goal in RSL history, assisted by **Emeka Eneli** and Luna on a play started at midfield by striker **Ariath Piol** ...

Following a 17th-minute equalizer by Houston on a set piece, it was Luna scoring just before halftime in the 50+ minute, using his maskless head to redirect a far-post shot from winger **Dominik Marczuk**, seizing momentum and shocking the Dynamo faithful ... A resolute RSL defense stood firm for the final 45-plus, with GK **Rafael Cabral** and several others demonstrating grit, guile and fortitude to see out the win, just the fourth-ever in RSL's nearly two-decades worth of trips to South Texas since 2007 ...

LUNA THE STAR OF THE SHOW ::

Real Salt Lake playmaker **Diego Luna** returned in late March from U.S. Men's National Team Head Coach **Mauricio Pochettino**'s 23-player roster in 2025 Concacaf Nations League ...

On March 15 in Houston, Luna ditched the mask protecting his once-shattered nose, triggering the play that led to RSL's 43-second score by **Diogo Gonçalves**, earning the secondary assist after combinations with **Ari Piol** and **Emeka Eneli** en route to RSL's fourth-fastest goal ever ...

Late in the first half, it was Luna who rescued a ball out of the corner, recycling the play and ultimately heading home the game-winning goal five minutes into first-half stoppage, redirecting a **Dominik Marczuk** laser to the far post ...

At 21 years of age, Luna – the reigning MLS Young Player of the Year, coming off an eight-goal, 12-assist campaign for RSL last season – is one of six MLS-based players who were part of the 2025 January Camp receiving the initial invite for the March matches ... Luna is also one of just three players, joining Patrick Agyemang (Charlotte) and Brian White (Vancouver), who also take part in their first USMNT camp during a FIFA international window and for an official competition ...

The annual January Camp has a long history of providing opportunities for MLS-based players to get an extended look from the coaching staff and make an impact ... Dating back to 1999, 30 players who have debuted or earned their second cap during the USMNT's first camp of a calendar year have gone on to make a FIFA World Cup roster ...

FOR CLUB AND COUNTRY ::

In January, Real Salt Lake saw two of its 2024 standouts – attacker **Diego Luna** and versatile Captain **Emeka Eneli** – amongst the 23 MLS players selected by Pochettino in this year's January's USA camp, including a 3-1 win over Venezuela in Ft. Lauderdale on Jan. 18 and a 3-0 win over Costa Rica on Jan. 22 in Orlando ...

Both Luna and Eneli played the final 27 minutes of the Venezuela win, with the RSL duo starting against Costa Rica, each player notching an assist ... Luna set up the game-winning Brian White goal on his first touch after a broken nose early in the contest, while Eneli also added an assist of his own on the second goal, late in the match ...

Despite having both nostrils filled with gauze, blood streaming down his face and looking like an extra from the famed David Fincher movie "Fight Club," Luna dominated the first half for the States, none of his creations more incisive than his 21st-minute throughball to O'Brian White, giving the home side a 1-0 lead ...

Luna played the first 45 only, setting up a game-high SIX big chances on either side of his battered and bloodied facial incident ...

Post-game, Luna was praised by Pochettino for his "big balls" refusal to exit the match ...

SAN DIEGO SHOCK ON UTAH SOIL ::

After a shock loss to San Diego at home on March 8, Real Salt Lake now owns a 9-4-3 (W-L-T) all-time mark against expansion sides making their initial visits to the Sandy venue over the previous 15 seasons, with only St. Louis, Cincinnati and LAFC able to grab the full three points at what is now known as America First Field prior to last week's stunning San Diego shocker ...

LAFC handed RSL its worst-ever home loss in March, 2018, a 5-1 win in that year's RSL home opener ... St.

Louis won at America First Field in 2023 during its first-ever visit, as did Cincinnati later that season (although the FCC trip did not come in their inaugural year) ...

After five losses in nine home games already this year across multiple competitions, the July slate kicking off Saturday against St. Louis affords the Claret-and-Cobalt yet another opportunity to seek a return to fortress-like protection of home soil, where a year ago RSL lost just three home games across all competitions, posting an impressively dominant 12-3-5 / 40-point mark in 2024 ...

ELIMINATED FROM CCC ::

Back on Feb. 26, RSL's elimination game against Herediano was RSL's fifth consecutive loss in knockout contests, and its seventh in its last nine overall since the 2023 U.S. Open Cup Semifinal run ...

At home, RSL had won its last three elimination matches on Utah soil prior to Feb. 26, last winning a shootout against Houston in the second leg of its 2023 Audi MLS Cup Playoff series ...

Earlier in 2023, RSL also defeated Liga MX power Leon that August, winning 2-1 after conceding the first goal in a Leagues Cup Round of 32 contest ... Two months prior, RSL won its Open Cup Quarterfinal match, also at home, against the LA Galaxy by a 3-2 margin to avoid elimination ...

In 2022, RSL dropped a Round of 32 Open Cup match at America First Field against a lower-division opponent, Hailstorm FC, in just the fourth home knockout contest of 17 overall elimination matches during the Mastroeni era ...

That number jumps to 18 if you include the 2021 "Decision Day" must-win "Damiracle" at Sporting Kansas City, RSL with the game-winning goal at 94:38, mere seconds from full-time, to advance to the postseason in Pablo's first year as manager, which saw RSL progress all the way to the West Final ...

MIDWEEK DEBUTANTS x5 ::

Five RSL players made their Club debuts with the midweek continental fixture in late February, as GK **Rafael Cabral**, DF **Kobi Henry** and FW **Forster Ajago** each started for Head Coach **Pablo Mastroeni**, while DF **Sam Junqua** and MF **Tyler Wolff** entered the match as substitutes ...

A trio of late-summer 2024 acquisitions also started that Wednesday, as Portuguese Designated Player **Diogo Gonçalves** was named by CONCACAF as the game's Michelob Ultra Player of the Match ... Diogo was joined by Polish winger **Dominik Marczuk** and Australian attacker **Lachlan Brook** to provide creativity ahead of RSL's staunch "Iron Man" pivots, **Braian Ojeda** and

Emeka Eneli – both of whom led RSL in minutes last year. Eneli wore the Captain's armband for the second time in his RSL career on Feb. 26, the youngest to ever do it ...

Fourth-year homegrown DF **Bode Hidalgo** started on the right with centerback **Brayan Vera** next to Henry and in front of Cabral, while left back **Alex Katranis** was removed from the match in the 19th minute after taking a close-range shot to the back of his head ...

Replaced by MLS veteran Junqua, other subs included the debutant Wolff, homegrown FW **Zavier Gozo** as well as the first appearance in 354 days by MF **Pablo Ruiz**, who played just three games last year after a meniscus injury in August, 2023, and an ACL setback in the opposite knee last March ...

With the Feb. 26 elimination, RSL's all-time record in CONCACAF Champions tourney games is now 11-6-7 (W-L-T), including a home mark of 8-2-2 (the lone previous home loss coming in the 2010/11 final to Monterrey) ...

COACHELLA VALLEY WRAP-UP ::

RSL concluded its 21st preseason seven weeks ago on **Wed., Feb. 12** at the Coachella Valley Invitational with a pair of friendlies, RSL coming from behind to draw New York Red Bulls, 3-3, with its presumptive starting XI, while the depth squad defeated Orange County SC, 3-1, in the second half of that day's doubleheader ...

FW **Forster Ajago** scored twice in the CVI match against New Jersey's MLS side, opening the game with a 10th-minute breakaway – assisted by new RSL GK **Rafael Cabral** – and also scoring the 81st minute equalizer by pouncing on a loose ball in the box ...

RSL saw DP playmaker **Diogo Gonçalves** cut the 3-1 Red Bull lead in half 10 minute prior to Ajago's equalizer, the Portuguese metronome also seizing upon a deflected ball at the top of the box to find the back of the net for the first time in his first full preseason with RSL ...

PERFECT v USL COMP ::

In the 3-1 win over Orange County, RSL saw second-half goals by homegrown DF **Tommy Silva**, recent college draft selection **Jesus Barea** and Australian newcomer **Ari Piol** ...

The now completely-healthy **Pablo Ruiz** started the goal-scoring sequences with exquisite left-footed switches to spring RSL forward, while the interplay between Piol and Barea freed each other on dangerous sequences ...

Earlier in the Coachella Valley tourney, RSL saw goals from **Noel Caliskan**, **Zavier Gozo** and **Tyler Wolff** in a 3-0 win over Las Vegas (USL Championship), while a stunning left-footed curler from Aussie **Lachlan Brook** earned RSL a 1-1 draw with St. Louis on Feb. 8 ...

INTERNATIONALLY KNOWN ::

In that final preseason tune-up, played exactly one week ahead of its CONCACAF Champions Cup opener in Costa Rica, RSL saw 10 nationalities represented in its presumed first-choice starting XI, lining up in a 4-2-3-1 formation without the ball:

CUP COMPETITIONS CONCLUDED FOR 2025 CAMPAIGN ::

While Real Salt Lake's CONCACAF Champions Cup tournament ended early in the 2025 campaign, the Claret-and-Cobalt went unbeaten during its participation in the third edition of Leagues Cup, hosting three Liga MX sides – Club América, Atletico San Luis and Queretaro – in Phase One at America First Field ... RSL captured six points in the three matches, a pair of 2-2 draws followed by splitting the dramatic PK shootouts, prior to a 1-0 win over Queretaro in the finale, failing to finish top four in the MLS Leagues Cup table (seven points and a +5 goal difference captured the fourth and final spot) ...

For the first time since 2015, RSL's reserve team – Real Monarchs SLC – flew the RSL flag in the 111-year-old Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, suffering a 120-minute loss to Bay Area amateur side El Farolito at Zions Bank Stadium ... The AET game-winner was a penalty kick in the 115th minute, with the “Burrito Boys” adding another deep into stoppage ...

The only RSL regular to feature was 20-year-old centerback **Kobi Henry**, who received his second yellow card in the 90th minute ...

2025 DEPARTURES ::

RSL's most “striking” roster changes for its 21st season happen up top, as former No. 9s **Chicho Arango** and **Anderson Julio** – who combined for 27 of the Club's all-time team-record 65 goals last season – have moved on from Utah ... Former captain Arango – who won RSL's 2024 Golden Boot with 17 goals in 2024, all prior to his mid-July suspension – was traded to Western Conference rival San Jose Earthquakes on January 13, while Julio – who scored a career-high 9 goals last season – was traded on Dec. 20 to FC Dallas ...

In January, MF **Matt Crooks** returned to the English Championship after one season on the Wasatch, while teenage GK **Gavin Beavers** was sold to legendary side Brøndby in the Danish First Division ...

RSL has also said goodbye to long-time Homegrown DF **Andrew Brody**, waived months ago as one of just two players in the Club's last 10 seasons to appear in 100+ matches for both RSL and Real Monarchs ...

ELIAS, WE HARDLY KNEW YA ::

Former New York Red Bull striker **Elias Manoel** was acquired on Dec. 20 to compete for a role in leading RSL's revamped 2025 attack, the Brazilian demonstrating danger and guile during his MLS career ...

However, RSL recently sold Manoel to Copa Libertadores champion and Brazilian power Botafogo – former home of one-time RSL attacker Jefferson Savarino – on the eve of the Club's home opener for the 2025 MLS season ...

Manoel – with his U.S. work visa sponsored by RSL and his green card process maintained by the Utah club – never reported to preseason, seeking new contract and more money after initially welcoming the trade from NYRB ...

NEW ARRIVALS ::

MF **Tyler Wolff** (Atlanta), DF **Sam Junqua** (Dallas) and FW **Forster Ajago** (Nashville) were also obtained in December via MLS trade/waiver mechanisms, while RSL also added eight players with collegiate experience in the 2025 MLS SuperDraft just prior to Christmas ...

In the January window, RSL also executed a loan agreement for young American DF **Kobi Henry** from French side Reims, with multiple other incoming transfers – including Brazilian GK **Rafael Cabral** and Australian FW **Ariath Piol** – were signed pending work visas prior to the team's late January departure for stage two of its 2025 training camp in Santa Barbara, Calif. ...

RETURNING TO THE MIX ::

Veteran RSL midfielder **Pablo Ruiz** is back to 100% health to kick off the 2025 season after suffering a pair of severe injuries in both August 2023 and April 2024, limiting the burgeoning Chilean international to just three MLS games played since an Aug. 6 Leagues Cup match at LAFC ...

After rehabbing the non-contact meniscus injury suffered in the 9th minute of that road match, Ruiz returned to play the first three matches of 2024 – at Miami and St. Louis, and at home in the “snowmageddon” match against LAFC – before suffering a season-ending ACL tear in a training collision in Herriman just a few days later ...

The versatile Ruiz – a deep-lying playmaker, often serving as RSL's metronome in 2022 / 23 – enters 2025 looking to play himself into “Comeback Player of the Year” consideration ...

Other RSL players looking to rebound from injury this year included 2024 MLS SuperDraft pick **Kevin Bonilla** – who suffered multiple injuries in his right knee last preseason, unfortunately suffering an Achilles injury in his 2025

preseason – and **Zack Farnsworth**, the former RSL Academy man who has spent the last four years coming back from ankle injuries suffered in the 2021 preseason, logging significant Monarchs minutes last year ...

DRAFT DAY DEALINGS ::

As a by-product of the **Elias Manoel** deal, RSL also acquired all of the New York Red Bulls' 2025 SuperDraft picks, while also moving up in the first round with General Allocation Money (GAM) trades for picks from both the Columbus Crew and LA Galaxy ... RSL ended up taking eight players out of the college acquisition mechanism, with 7 of the 8 picks reporting to this year's combined RSL / Monarchs first stage of preseason, with just FW **Sergi Solans** (Oregon State) returning to college for another year ...

Overall on Dec. 20, RSL selected eight players via the 2025 MLS SuperDraft, including a quartet of first-round picks – FW **Jesus Barea** (19th overall out of Missouri State), GK **Max Kerkvliet** (21st / UConn), FW **Lineker Rodrigues dos Santos** (29th / Marshall) and FW **Sergi Solans** (30th / Oregon State) ... RSL's four first-rounders marked the second-most of the initial round (Colorado, five) en route to the second-most picks throughout the entire draft (also Colorado, nine overall) ...

RSL entered draft day with only the 19th, 49th and 79th overall picks in the event's three rounds, but added three more just hours prior to the 2025 MLS SuperDraft as part of its acquisition of veteran Brazilian FW **Elias Manoel**, with RSL send \$700,000 in future GAM to New York, taking each of the Red Bulls' natural selections (29th, 59th and 89th overall), as well as New York's natural second rounder in next year's draft ...

During the first round, RSL also acquired two more picks, sending \$75,000 in 2024 GAM to the Columbus Crew for the 21st overall pick (Kerkvliet) and \$50,000 to LA Galaxy for the 30th overall pick (Solans), the final selection of the first round ...

Later that day, RSL recouped \$400,000 in GAM from FC Dallas in exchange for FW Anderson Julio, while also acquiring versatile veteran MLS DF **Sam Junqua** in a depth move ...

FIRST FULL PRESEASONS ::

Much of RSL's 2025 roster work was accomplished last August, when new arrivals in the form of DP playmaker **Diogo Gonçalves**, U22 winger **Dominik Marczuk**, MF **Lachlan Brook** and DF **Javain Brown** donned the Claret-and-Cobalt ...

With a full preseason in advance of the mid-February CONCACAF foray, each player's flashes of brilliance from last Fall hopefully blossom into impactful stretches and consistent depth as RSL juggles eight games in 27 days

to kick off 2025, and the potential of 19 games across multiple competitions in the first 74 days from mid-Feb. to early May with a successful Champions Cup run ...

HOMEGROWN FACTORY ::

RSL's homegrown poster boy, 27-year-old centerback **Justen Glad**, returns for his 11th season with the Claret-and-Cobalt, leading the charge amongst the 15 homegrowns on RSL's 2025 roster ... Glad – who needs just 6 more MLS games played to move past **Tony Beltran** and **Chris Wingert** into third-place overall amongst MLS performers – is joined by DF **Bode Hidalgo** and DF **Tommy Silva** as RSL Academy products in the 2025 mix ...

FW **Zavier Gozo** – who made his MLS debut late in the 2023 season, and played just 11 minutes last year – is joined by several others, including FW **Axel Kei**, MF **Owen Anderson**, DF **Luis Rivera**, MF **Jude Wellings**, MF **Gio Villa**, MF **Aiden Hezarkhani** and DF **Omar Marquez** as players on MLS contracts looking to make an impact this season ...

All told, RSL has signed 45 players to HG contracts in the last 15 seasons, outpacing FC Dallas for the league-high contribution ...

2024 MILESTONES IN REVIEW ::

The record-setting 2024 RSL side amassed the Club's eighth 50-point season all-time (out of 20 seasons), and just the third since the 2014 campaign ... Finishing 6th overall out of 29 teams, RSL crashed out of the postseason by the thinnest of margins for a third consecutive year (Austin 2022, Houston 2023, Minnesota 2024), dropping a road shootout tiebreaker ...

Other 2024 RSL milestones:

Accumulated an all-time Club-high overall point total of 59 points, RSL's 16-7-11 (W-L-T) record eclipsing the previous record of 57 points, set in 2012; the 16 wins in 34 games matches the Club's second-highest win total in its 20 MLS campaigns (2013, 2019), trailing only the 17 won in 2012 ...

Achieved RSL's second-highest road record with 13 results in 17 away MLS matches, posting a 5W-4L-8T mark, with 23 of its 59 reg. season points amassed on the road; RSL's previous road best was recorded in 2023, with an outstanding 8W-5L-4T (28 pts) mark ...

RSL attained 59 points in 2024 by returning its America First Field home to "fortress" status, the Club's home mark of 11W-3L-3T the fourth-best in MLS and the fifth-highest in RSL's 20 previous MLS seasons ...

This most recent campaign was also the highest-scoring season in Real Salt Lake's 20 MLS years, with 65 goals

through 34 matches, eclipsing the 57 scored in 2013; RSL's pair of goals scored on Decision Day enabled the 2024 side to match the all-time Club mark of 38 goals on home soil, matching the 2018 season's production in Sandy ...

During a nearly four-month span from early-March to late June, RSL embarked on a Club-record 15-game unbeaten run in MLS competition, marred only by an Open Cup match in Albuquerque ...

RSL striker and former Captain **Chicho Arango** scored 17 goals and added 13 assists during his first full season on the Wasatch Front, winning the Club Golden Boot and matching Alvaro Saborio's all-time RSL high for goals in a season, set in 2012 ...

HOME FORTRESS BOUNCEBACK ::

RSL's 2025 slate, including 34 MLS regular-season matches – along with multiple Leagues Cup contests (at least 3 from July 30 to Aug. 6 against LIGA MX powers) – could have seen the team play four of its first eight **at its America First Field home** – where RSL went 12-3-4 (W-L-T) in 2024 – with CCC advancement prior to a three-game road trip from April 26 – May 10 ...

Since April 16, 2005, RSL has enjoyed a prominent home-field advantage on Utah soil – posting a dominant 209-91-100 (Win-Loss-Draw) record across all competitions at home (1.83 points per game for a 0.654 win pct.) – since arriving on the Wasatch Front 20 years ago ...

Since opening its permanent home in Sandy just over 15 years ago, in October, 2008, RSL's 179-66-80 (W-L-T) mark at America First Field – home of the "RioT" Supporters Group umbrella – equates to a 1.92 points per game average and a 0.682 win pct, one of the truly amazing value proposition in North American sporting landscape today ...

2025 MILESTONES TO FOLLOW ::

With its home win on March 1 against Seattle, RSL boasted its 13th home MLS reg. season win vs. the Sounders, RSL's second-highest all-time total of home wins (13, also KC/DAL) ... RSL's 18 home wins against Colorado sets the standard ...

The near-sellout on March 1 also gave RSL 6 million total fans on Utah soil since April 16, 2005, in both MLS reg. season and Audi MLS Cup Playoffs action ...

Others to watch:

- RSL's win April 5 against LA Galaxy gave the Club 250 all-time (MLS Reg. Season only)
- RSL's home win over Houston was its 175th all-time (MLS Reg. Season only)
- Months ago, **Justen Glad** passed Wingert/Beltran and move into 3rd all-time with 248 MLS appearances (Rimando/Beckerman)
- Glad needs 2.5 seasons at 2700 each to catch Beckerman's nearly 30,000 minutes
- **Pablo Ruiz** needs one MLS assist to move into the Club's Top-10 all-time
- MacMath needs 2 MLS appearances & starts to reach 100 in goal for each RSL category
- MacMath needs 3 wins with RSL to reach 40 all-time (reg. Season)
- MacMath needs 5 saves with RSL to reach 300 all-time (reg. Season)
