### CVI FIRST TIMERS

**14 players** are making their first CVI trip with Portland this year.

**First-Team signings:** Cole Bassett, Alex Bonetig, and Brandon Bye will make their competitive debuts for the Timbers in Indio. Designated Players David Da Costa and Kristoffer Velde will make their CVI debuts after joining in 2025.

Joining them are supplemental players from the club's MLS NEXT Pro affiliate Timbers2, academy, and MLS Superdraft.

### RETURNING TO INDIO

Of Portland's 31-man preseason roster, 17 players are returning to Indio with the Timbers from last year's Coachella Valley Invitational. Notably, five players have been a part of all of Portland's three previous CVI editions and are in Indio for a fourth-straight year: **Diego Chara, Juan Mosquera, Felipe Mora, and Hunter Sulte.**

Six players on the squad are taking part in their third CVI with Portland – **James Pantemis, Trey Muse, Eric Miller, Kamal Miller, Antony, and Sawyer Jura.**

### NEW SIGNINGS

#### **Cole Bassett #17 - Midfielder**

Joined on Feb. 2, after seven seasons (2018-25) with Colorado. In 2025, Bassett notched seven goal contributions (3g, 4a) in 28 appearances. Bassett in total appeared in 157 matches (130 starts) for Colorado, amassing 31 goals and 23 assists in MLS play. Notably, Bassett received three-consecutive MLS 22 under 22 selections (2019-21), peaking at No. 10 in 2021. Bassett has overseas experience, going on loan to Eredivisie side Feyenoord Rotterdam (recorded one assist in eight appearances) and Fortuna Sittard (one goal in 11 appearances) in 2022. Bassett has one goal in one senior appearance for the USMNT.

#### **Brandon Bye #5 Defender/Right-back**

Joined on Dec. 22, 2025, after spending his entire eight-year career with New England (2018-25, drafted eighth overall in the 2018 MLS SuperDraft). Most recently, Bye, 30, logged 26 appearances (12 starts) in 2025 for NE. In total, he made 192 regular season appearances (161 starts), recording 10 goals and 18 assists for the Revs.

#### **Alex Bonetig #6 - Defender/Centerback**

Joined on Jan. 7, after climbing the ranks of the A-League Men's Western Sydney Wanderers academy. Bonetig, 23, made his pro top-flight debut on Jan. 22, 2023. In total he registered 61 appearances for Western Sydney playing over 5,000 minutes. Bonetig received an Australia senior call up in June 2025, but has yet to make his international debut.

## SEASON OPENER: TIMBERS HOST COLUMBUS

The Portland Timbers kickoff their 16th season in MLS on Saturday, Feb. 21, against the Columbus Crew at Providence Park.

The Timbers and Crew have previously met in Matchday 1 on March 6, 2016, a match Portland won 2-1. Notably, it marked the first match between the two sides since the 2015 MLS Cup Final in Columbus on Dec. 6, 2015 – a match Portland also won 2-1.

In total, Portland and Columbus have faced-off 14 times in MLS (including playoffs). The Timbers hold the head-to-head series advantage at 7-3-4. Portland has outscored the Crew 22-18 in their matchups, with the biggest margin of victory coming on April 20, 2019, via a 3-1 win in Columbus.

## SEASON OPENERS

The Timbers are set to open their MLS season at Providence Park for the fifth year in a row, dating back to the 2022 season. In that span, Portland has a 2-1-1 record in the season openers, outscoring opponents 8-7.

Dating back to their inaugural MLS campaign in 2011, the Timbers have posted a record of 5-5-5, and have outscored opponents 28-26 in all season openers. When hosting the first match of the season, Portland is an impressive 5-2-4 at Providence Park and have outscored their opponents 23-17.

In all 15 home openers, the Timbers are 8-3-4, outscoring opponents 34-25.

This year's season opener is on February 21. Portland has only played four games in the second month of the year, recording two wins, a loss, and a draw while scoring eight goals and allowing seven in February matches.

## 2025 IN NUMBERS

**2** – Two current Timbers set new career and season-highs in goals, and goal contributions in 2025:

**Antony** registered **seven goals** and **seven assists** last season for a total of **14 goal contributions**, a team-high and career-best in MLS in both categories.

**Kevin Kelsy** added a career-best **seven goals** (tied for team-high with Antony) and two assists (career-high in the 2025 campaign). Additionally, Kelsy scored in U.S. Open Cup and Leagues Cup play, bringing his total goals across all competitions in 2025 to nine – a club-high on the year.

**6** – Of the 15 different goalscorers in 2025, six current Timbers registered their first goals for the Green and Gold last year. David Da Costa (4), Kristoffer Velde (2), Gage Guerra (2), Kamal Miller (2), Ian Smith (1) and Omir Fernandez (1).

**48 - 48 goals allowed** through 34 games is the club's lowest since the 2018 season (48) and first time Portland finished the regular season with under 50 goals allowed since 2019.

**7** – Portland's defense registered **seven shutouts** in 2025, with Timbers goalkeeper James Pantemis (19 appearances) responsible for four of the clean sheets.

## IRON SURMAN

Defender Finn Surman played and started in 31 of 34 matches for Portland in the 2025 season, ranking third and second for the club, in appearances and starts, respectively. He out-right led the Timbers in minutes played (2,721), clearances (67), aerial duels (95), and passing accuracy (92%) while being second in successful passes (1,501) and passes attempted (1,635).

Internationally, Surman registered his second goal for New Zealand in a friendly against Norway last Oct. 14. He has 15 caps for the All-Whites.

## DEVELOPING TALENT

In 2025, five players made their Timbers first team debut following time in the Timbers Academy, Timbers2, or the 2025 MLS SuperDraft. Timbers Academy: Noah Santos and Daniel Nuñez  
Timbers2: Gage Guerra and Kyle Linhares  
2025 MLS SuperDraft: Ian Smith

Notably, Gage Guerra contributed two goals and Ian Smith a goal and an assist for the first team in 2025.

## PROVIDENCE PARK IN MLS

The Timbers are 131-51-67 all-time at Providence Park in MLS play, scoring 447 goals at their home stadium. Portland has won double-digit home games five times (2013, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2021), with its best season coming in 2016 in which the club finished 12-3-2 at home. The Timbers best scoring season at home came in 2024, with 39 goals being scored in Goose Hollow.

In the MLS Cup Playoffs, the Timbers are 6-2-6, and have hosted a Western Conference Final and MLS Cup Final at Providence Park (2021). The most goals scored by Portland in a single postseason at the stadium is six, set in 2021.

The historic stadium hosted the 2014 MLS All-Star game on Wednesday, Aug. 4, 2014. It was the 19th edition of the MLS festivities, and first to feature a German opponent. The 2014 MLS All-Stars team, led by Timbers coach Caleb Porter, defeated the reigning 2013 FIFA Club World Cup Champions and 2013-14 Bundesliga Winners FC Bayern Munich by a 2-1 scoreline. Landon Donovan won All-Star Game MVP following his 70th minute game-winner, assisted by Timbers Ring of Honor member Diego Valeri. Three Timbers were selected to the All-Star game, a single-season club record: Diego Valeri, Liam Ridgewell, and Will Johnson.

Home to the Portland Timbers, Providence Park is celebrating its 100th Anniversary in 2026. The Goose Hollow-neighborhood stadium seats a capacity of 25,218, the sixth largest capacity of soccer-specific stadiums in the country. Formerly named Jeld-Wen Field, PGE Park, Civic Stadium and originally named Multnomah Stadium in 1926 when construction was completed, Providence Park is currently the oldest soccer-specific stadium in Major League Soccer and fourth-oldest major league stadium in the United States.

## 2026 SCHEDULE

### Home stands and road trips

The Timbers will have the most home games, three, in the months of August and September. Their longest time away from home will be in April, May, and October, all consisting of three matches on the road.

### Cascadia Cup Clashes

Portland will aim to win their seventh Cascadia Cup in 2026. The Timbers host Vancouver on March 7, and travel to BC Place on April 4. Portland will travel to Seattle on July 16, following the league-wide FIFA World Cup break, and will host Seattle at Providence Park on August 1.

### Theme Nights at Providence Park

The Portland Timbers will host five Cultural Celebration Nights, honoring Black Excellence (Feb. 21 vs CLB), AAPI (May 9 vs SKC), PRIDE (July 25 vs RSL), Hispanic Heritage (Sept. 19 vs ATL) and Native American Heritage (Nov. 1 vs HOU). In partnership with Bank of America, each Cultural Celebration Night features a limited-edition scarf designed by a local Oregon artist. In addition, to celebrate Soccer City, USA, the Timbers are hosting Soccer City USA Day (March 22 vs. LA), Soccer Celebration Send-Off in honor of the 2026 FIFA World Cup (May 23 vs. SJ), Rivalry Night (Aug. 1 vs. SEA) and 100 Years of Providence Park Celebration (Oct. 17 vs. COL).

### Battles with the Eastern Conference


Timbers to face six Eastern conference foes: Columbus Crew (2/21), Atlanta United FC (8/19) and Charlotte FC (10/24) at home. Portland will travel to play CF Montréal (5/13), Inter Miami CF (5/17) and Chicago Fire FC (8/16).

### Decision Day 2026

The final matchday of the MLS regular season with MLS Cup Playoffs implications on the line, will take place on Saturday, November 7. Portland will travel to Austin, Texas, to take on Austin FC at Q2 Stadium. All Western Conference Decision Day matches will kick off at 4 p.m. (Pacific).

## CHARA'S MILESTONE

Diego Chara's next start will mark 400 MLS regular season starts. Currently at 399, Chara is set to become the 13th player to reach the milestone in league history. Notably, he'll become the first player in MLS history to start 400 matches with one club. The club's all-time leader in games played is 9th all-time in minutes played (35,820) in MLS history.




